SOFT FOOD BAD AS CANDY FOR TEETH

Candy, which has always been assigned as a menace to children's teeth is no worse than soft foods, according to the latest investigations of dentists and dieticians.

"The tendency of parents is to allow their children to eat too much soft food," says Hazel Rawson Cades, beauty expert, in Farm and Fireside. Plenty of coarse food will prevent much of the damage that heretofore has been laid to sweetmeats in which all children delight.

Miss Cades also declares that there is no longer any excuse for cross eyed children, since modern medical science can correct the fault if doctors are called when the affliction first becomes apparent. Protruding ears are another disfigurement that need no longer worry mothers. Net caps, she says, will often correct the fault in babies and a slight surgical operation will complete the cure if nature fails.

Many an ugly child can be made into a beautiful one, the writer continues, by early attention to adenoids which usually result in an expression of extreme stupidity on a child's face.
