CULINARY HINTS

I have been having some requests for a Chicken a la King recipe and, as I think there will be others who will like to have it, I am giving you that recipe this week. This is one of the most delicious as well as one of the most attractive dishes and may be served in different ways—either in patty shells or on toast, or served with baking powder biscuits broken apart when they are done and put together with the Chicken a la King, like little shortcakes. Serve individually or on one large serving dish.

The white meat of the chicken is better for this, and you will find it more attractive, though any left over chicken may be used. For the mushrooms, the small can of button mushrooms is the right amount. These are better than the stems and pieces, though the latter are satisfactory for many other dishes. Use fresh mushrooms, if you prefer.

Chicken a la King

- 4 tab. butter.
- ¼ cup green pepper cut in fine strips.
- 3 tab. flour.
- 1 ½ cups strained chicken broth.
- 1 cup mushrooms—sliced.
- 1 pimento cut in fine strips.
- 2 cups cooked chicken cut in pieces from one half to one inch.
- Salt to taste.
- ¼ teas. paprika.
- ¼ cup cream.
- 1 egg yolk.

A few drops of lemon juice. Melt butter in double boiler, add green pepper and cook about five minutes, add flour and stir until well blended; then stir in the chicken broth, add mushrooms and let simmer about ten minutes, stirring often. Add chicken, salt and paprika. Just before serving, add the well beaten egg yolk mixed with the cream and stir just until well blended and heated. Remove from fire and add the lemon juice.

Milk may be used in place of the chicken broth, in which case use two cups of milk and omit cream. If there are any of the ingredients you do not care for, they may be omitted. (Next week—Steamed Orange Pudding).
