made available for this work. "The undertaking has proven wonderfully successful. Since it was started 4,509 Junior Bird clubs have been formed in Illinois with a total membership of 152,621. The object of this campaign is to cultivate in the mind of the youth of the land a . better appreciation of the value of wild bird life to mankind."


