Mr. Guedalla is one of the kindest and most tactful of our commentators. Contrary to the custom of visiting ture and life. critics he goes so far as to suggest that an almost non-stop trip across the continent has not enabled him to solve our race, crime and prohibition problems. In short, Mr. Guedalla proves himself as tactful, as discerning and as considerate as we had expected him to be.

"Conquistador" is a purely delight ful book. It is in the lighter vein as "American Fantasia" and its dedication "To my charming guardians, the Pullman Porters of America."

It is delightful first of all for its style, that style which never fails Mr. Guedalla, which he uses as a good fencer his sword, swiftly, brilliantly, lightful idyll. with dexterity and not often to wound.

In the second place "Conquistador" is delightful because of the revelation it makes of Mr. Guedalla himself. 
