DRIVER MAY BE LIABLE

Frequently in Case of Accident He Is Blamed by Self-Invited Guest and Damages Are Sought

"The plea, 'Gimme a lift, Mister,' is echoing down the streets and highways of the nation, as hundreds of thousands of childrens and young students daily troop to and from their schools.

" 'Ride-mooching' - hitch-hiking lift-seeking — by whatever name you call it - is a dangerous, demoralizing practice. Dangerous, because it is responsible for many accidents; demoralizing because it is in the class of pan-handling, trying to get something for nothing," says Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club.

"The appeal of a child is hard to resist, but the interests of safety demand that the motorist be firm in his refusal to accede to requests for free rides. And this practice, unfortunately, is not confined alone to children; men and women on cross-country hikes are not averse to asking for and accepting lifts.

Incur Liability

"Unfortunately, few motorists realize the liability they incur when they invite a person to ride as a guest. With 'ride-mooching' on the increase, motorists should remember that others who have granted requests for rides have paid dearly for their kind-

"Every year, law suits arise because of injujries sustained by passengers in Hugh, WD 10 Pt Lot 216, Lake Forautomobiles," points out Mr. Hayes. est. "The motorists who have been forced to defend such suits have learned their lesson, and the experiences of these motorists should be a warning to those who feel charitably inclined to the youth on the highway seeking a

Possibilties

"If a motorist is the unfortunate victim of a collision in which a passenger is hurt, or if the passenger is injured through jumping off the car before it has stopped, if he trips and falls while getting off the running board, it is possible that the car owner may be forced to compensate the injured person.

"It is true, that if the motorist contests some of these cases, chances are that he will win, but litigation is uncertain and expensive, and in most cases he might be willing to settle by paying a small sum, in order to be released from further liability," says Mr. Hayes in conclusion.
