JUDGMENT REQUISITE IN OPERATING MOTOR DRIVER MUST USE HEAD

Frequently Situations Arise in Which There Is No Specific Law Provision to Guide; Suggestions

"In driving a car, one finds himself in certain situations which are governed by no definite provision of law, and in such situations the driver must be guided by his best judgment," says Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor Club.

"Every motorist knows that he must stop at boulevards and through streets, but many drivers are in doubt as to their rights after they have complied with this law.

Crossing Streets
"The driver crossing such streets must wait until he sees that traffic is clear before proceeding to cross," Mr. Hayes points out. Various courts have held that traffic is clear when no cars are seen approaching within 75 to 150 feet. Nor can the driver who crosses a boulevard assume that because traffic is clear on the left-hand side that it is also clear on the right. He cannot head into traffic simply because he has complied with the ordinance requiring him to stop. He must see that his way is clear.

On Boulevards
"As a general rule of law, it should be remembered that a moving vehicle has the right of way over standing vehicles, and consequently a greater degree of caution must be used by the driver of the standing vehicle.

"Some motorists believe that after they have stopped at a boulevard they may rely upon the right hand right of way law, and if they are on the right hand side assume the right of way. The right hand right of way law does not apply at Boulevards," declares Mr. Hayes. The driver on the boulevard, however, should not believe that he is on a boulevard. He, too, is obliged to use care. In conclusion, Mr. Hayes says:

"The measure or test of conduct of an operator of a motor vehicle at a boulevard intersection must necessarily be, 'What would the ordinary prudent man do under the same or similar circumstances?'"

NATIONAL PARKS TO OPEN EARLY IN 1928

TWO WEEKS SOONER, PLAN Decision Made Because of Mildness of Winter and Lack of Heavy Snows; Motor Club Report Says

National parks will open two weeks earlier than usual this year, because of the mildness of the past season and the absence of heavy snows which would bar the parks from touring, according to a bulletin from the touring bureau of the Chicago Motor Club. This opening date was announced March 30, by the superintendent of Yellowstone Park and Assistant Director of the Park Service, Horace M. Albright.

This will be good news to the automobile tourists, who make up the great majority of the more than 2,000,000 sightseers who yearly visit the parks.

New Features
There will be new things to see this year. Probably the outstanding feature will be the opening up of the northern rim of the Grand Canyon. For scores of years the tourist has seen the Canyon only from the south rim. It has been accessible from the Arizona side only, but now it may be viewed from the north. On that side the cliffs are a thousand feet higher than on the south; the country is wilder; the timber heavier.

This year for the first time, tourists may cross the Canyon by riding mules down the rugged Kaibab trail, across a swinging bridge, and up on the south side.

Zion Park
A number of new roads will be opened up this season, one of them in Zion Park, on which \$1,300,000 is being spent in eight miles, a mile and a half of which is through tunnels, is now half way through. Even in far away Alaska a road is being cut into Mount McKinley National Park, gradually opening up more of the wild scenery of this far northern spot.

New hotels are being established, transportation facilities are being increased, and it is estimated that the number of National Park visitors will reach 3,000,000 this year.

At 72, Man Eats 60 Eggs in Fifteen Minutes

J. W. Carnifex, aged seventy-two, a resident of Hico, ate sixty eggs in fifteen minutes at the general store of I. L. Sandige in that town.
