evening 9:50 p. m. Cost of this trip for scoutmasters and assistants will be \$4 which includes railroad transportation but is exclusive of Pullman. Chair cars will be provided for those who do not desire a Pullman. A fee of \$6.00 will be charged all troop committeemen and other scout officials.

In a letter to parents, scout executive, Walter McPeck, outlines some reasons why a period at Owasippe will pay dividends in boy character. The Owasippe scout camps, 7 in number, accommodate at one time over 1000 scouts. These camps, because of their successful and efficient operation, have become known nationally and are the largest boys' camp west of the Allegheny mountains.

They are conducted by the Chicago council, Boy Scouts of America and are located near Whitehall (Muskegon county), Michigan. (P. O. address—Owasippe, Michigan).
