

**DECISION ON PERMIT FOR HOTEL IS AWAITED**

**If Adverse, Probability Is One-Story Structure Will Be Result; Report**

No definite decision has so far been made in the matter of the issue of a permit for the erection of the hotel building at Sheridan road and Park avenue, which Schneider & Hundley are planning to build. It appears to be difficult to get an interpretation of the zoning ordinance as the restrictions on the height of buildings of this character.

Mr. Schneider says that he is tired of delay and being "kicked around from pillar to post." The probability is that some sort of building will be erected on the property, even if the decision is adverse to the hotel project, and if it is, the prospect is that only one-story store buildings will be the result, with the usual conditions in the rear. With garage and service stations and that type of structures on the property the objectionable features, as far as neighboring residents are concerned, undoubtedly would be increased, but so long as really fine improvements are frowned upon in this city, Mr. Schneider says, property owners must accept the alternative and build the kind of structures permitted in order to get some revenue from their real estate in the business district.
