**BANDITS MURDER MILBURN FARMER**  
**WILLIAM BECK IS VICTIM**  
**Indian and Two Negroes Captured in Chicago; Admit Man Was Shot by Another of Their Party**

Because he resisted three armed bandits, William Beck, Jr., 35 years old, who lived on a farm near Milburn with his aged parents, was shot in the abdomen and fatally wounded last Wednesday night. He died Thursday morning at 5:30 o'clock at the Victory Memorial hospital, Waukegan, where he was taken in an ambulance a short time after being found by deputies from the office of Sheriff Lawrence A. Doolittle, in a dying condition.

After shooting Beck, one of the bandits who was most familiar with the premises went into a bedroom and opened a bureau drawer and removed \$3,500 worth of registered United States bonds. Beck although wounded fought stubbornly for some little time with one of the bandits in a desperate effort to frustrate the robbery, but was finally overpowered and was hurled to the floor. His hands and feet were bound with cord.

**Mother Is Gagged, Bound**  
Mrs. Anna Beck, 75 years old, mother of the dead man, who was asleep in a room upstairs with her husband, William Beck, Sr., was awakened by the scuffling on the first floor and went downstairs. When she saw her son being abused, she started to run towards the door, intending to call for help. One of the bandits who was standing at this door grabbed the aged woman and threw her heavily to the kitchen floor. She kept crying out for help and a handkerchief was thrust into her mouth, gagging her. The bandits then tightly bound her hands and feet with cord.

After taking the registered bonds, demand was made by one of the bandits, o. Beck to tell where he and his father had hidden their money. He told them he had but \$16 in cash in the house. The bandit told him he was lying and threatened to kill him unless he gave the desired information. Beck pleaded for his life. He begged the bandits to free his mother, but they only jeered and kicked him and then left by the way of the back door.

With but a few hours elapsed after Beck was shot down in cold blood two of the murderers were apprehended, a third is cornered and two others are believed to be in Chicago, it was learned from Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle.

The catch includes "The Indian," Dominick Henry Bresette, 33, full blooded Chippewa who planned the robbery, and John Brown, 3623 Indiana avenue, Chicago, a negro, and the man near arrest is Claud Pauchamp, a negro, who has a rendezvous near 31 and State street.

Two other negroes, who drove the trio to the scene of the robbery, are believed to be known by the Chicago Detective Bureau and the Maxwell street police.

A warrant charging murder was issued for Brisette by Justice Harry Hoyt and four John Doe warrants charging murder were issued for the rest of the gang.

**Indian Confesses**  
The Indian confessed Thursday night to Capt. Daniel Lynch at the Maxwell street station in the presence of Sheriff Doolittle, Deputy George Heckinger, Detective Sergeant Bart Tyrrell, George Stried, George Hargrave and Harold Finer, from States Attorney Smith's office.

At the same time detectives announced that Brown, a negro with an ape forehead, had made a full confession.

Both named Claude Pauchamp as the killer of Beck. They both said that Pauchamp deliberately shot Beck because he started to close the door, when he saw the masked men.

Pauchamp had the stolen treasury bonds, they charge. Neither of them had any of them with them.

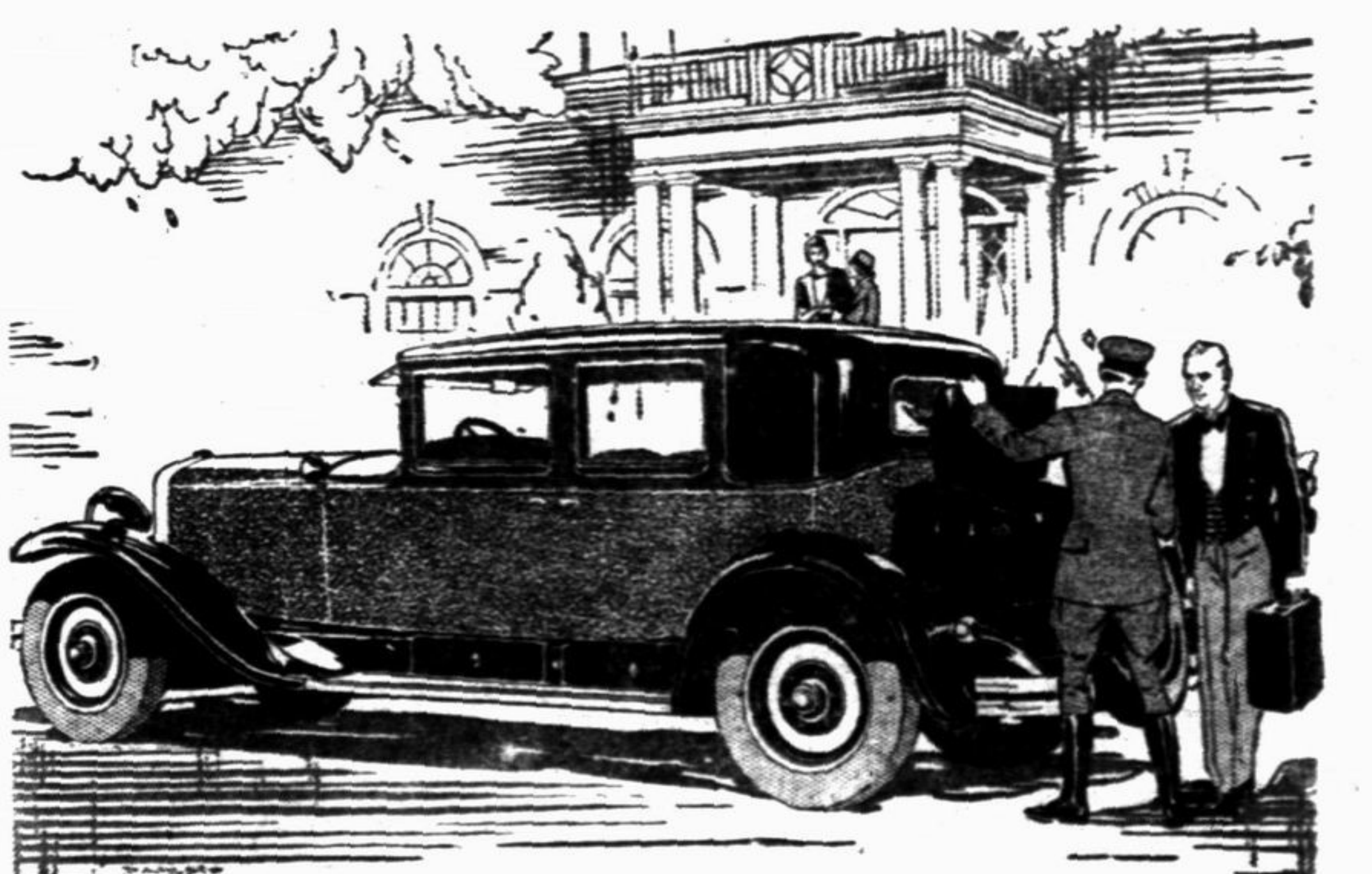
**PLAN LAKE FRONT PARK UP TO STATE BOUNDARY**

Establishment of a lake front park that will stretch from the Dunes of Indiana to the Wisconsin state line with the purchase of the land lying along the shore from Waukegan to the state line by the state as the first move in the project was urged in a resolution passed by the parks and public recreation committee of the Chicago city club in meeting Friday. The project if carried out would prove a continuation to the park and drive planned along the north beach of Waukegan and which is being voted upon at the polls as one of the propositions in the city construction program bond issue today.

If the measure carries the beach drive and park here would be the first link in the proposed extensive park system.

Several movements have been started in the past to induce the along the lake shore from Waukegan to the state line for state park purposes. The greatest headway along this line was made by the Waukegan Woman's club, two years ago, when it aroused the interest of the state in the beauties of this stretch of beach and impressed many as to its value for state park purposes. The movement resulted in the introducing of a bill in the state legislature by the late Representative Wm. F. Weis, but this measure failed in passage.
