The authority for this is Dr. Henry Norris Russell, research astronomy professor at Princeton university.

Dr. Walter S. Adams, director of the Mount Wilson observatory said he did not incline to the evolution theory, the theory that another star had been born into the ether.

"I am more inclined to believe," he said, "that there was a collision and what once was Nova Pictoris is now two stars due to Nova Pictoris splitting into two sections. This is vastly important to the scientific world."

"The vast importance" of the phepomenon is not confined to the scientific world, amateur astronomers point out.

I; would be more "vastly important' to a lot of laymen if this globe should collide with a star and be split into halves, as Nova Pictoris is believed by scientists to have done.


