

**NOTICE OF AWARDED CONTRACT**  
 NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested that bids for the furnishing of all labor, tools and materials necessary for the construction of a connected system of cast iron water mains in Clavey Road, Ellswood, Clavey, Sumner Road, Kestrew Road and Rosemary Road, all in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, were opened on the 2nd day of July, A. D. 1928, and the E. A. Meyer Construction Company being the lowest responsible bidder, the contract was awarded to the said E. A. Meyer Construction Company on the 9th day of July, A. D. 1928.

Said bid for the work is as follows:

ITEM NO. 1.  
 530 lineal feet of eight (8) inch asphaltic coated bell and spigot cast iron pipe weighing forty-seven and five-tenths (47.5) pounds per lineal foot; the top of the pipe shall be laid five feet six inches (5'-6") below the surface of the ground where located; laid with joints of lead and jute, including all clearing, grubbing, trenching, shoring, bracing, pumping, calking, testing, backfilling with earth, flushing the backfill, restoration of existing pavement where damaged, and removal of all surplus excavated materials, laid complete at One Dollar Forty-Two Cents (\$1.42) per lineal foot ..... \$ 1,001.70

ITEM NO. 2.  
 4015 lineal feet of six (6) inch asphaltic coated bell and spigot cast iron pipe, weighing thirty-three and three-tenths (33.3) pounds per lineal foot. The top of the pipe shall be laid five feet six inches (5'-6") below the surface of the ground where located; laid with joints of lead and jute, including all clearing, grubbing, trenching, shoring, bracing, pumping, calking, testing, backfilling with earth, flushing the backfill, restoration of existing pavement where damaged, and removal of all surplus excavated materials, laid complete at One Dollar Forty-Two Cents (\$1.42) per lineal foot ..... 5,701.30

ITEM NO. 3.  
 5000 pounds of asphaltic coated bell and spigot cast iron pipe fittings, with joints of lead and jute, complete in place at No. 10, complete in place at No. 10, Dollars Six and one-half Cents (\$6.06 1/2) per pound ..... 585.00

ITEM NO. 4.  
 3 eight (8) inch cast iron body, bronze mounted, bronze stemmed double gate water valves for one hundred fifty (150) pounds working pressure, with joints calked with lead and jute, including cutting existing eight (8) inch water pipe, placing said valves to line and grade, and testing, complete in place at Fifty Dollars No Cents (\$50.00) each ..... 150.00

ITEM NO. 5.  
 4 twelve (12) inch cast iron body, bronze mounted, bronze stemmed, double gate water valves for one hundred fifty (150) pounds working pressure, with joints calked with lead and jute, including cutting existing twelve (12) inch water pipe, placing said valves to line and grade, and testing, complete in place at Ninety One Dollars No Cents (\$91.00) each ..... 364.00

ITEM NO. 6.  
 11 six (6) inch cast iron body, bronze mounted, bronze stemmed, double gate water valves for one hundred fifty (150) pounds working pressure, with joints calked with lead and jute, including testing, and set to line and grade, complete in place at Thirty Dollars No Cents (\$30.00) each ..... 330.00

ITEM NO. 7.  
 18 valve vaults constructed of concrete composed by volume of one (1) part Portland cement, two (2) parts sand, and four (4) parts gravel or crushed stone, mixed with sufficient water to make a quaking mass. Said concrete can be either monolithic or concrete blocks. If constructed of monolithic concrete, forms shall be placed on both sides of the walls; the inside diameter shall be four (4) feet from the top of the bottom to a plane three (3) feet below the top of the concrete, from which plane the diameter shall decrease uniformly to two (2) feet at the top of the concrete; sidewalls and bottoms shall be six (6) inches, and the bottoms shall extend to the outside face of the walls. Each valve vault shall be furnished with an asphaltic coated cast iron manhole cover, consisting of a frame weighing three hundred ninety (390) pounds, and a lid weighing one hundred fifty (150) pounds; said solid lid shall be set to grade where located. The top of the bottom of said valve vaults shall be six (6) inches below the bottom of the water pipe; including all excavation, backfilling, flushing the backfill, and removal of all surplus excavated materials; complete at Eighty Dollars No Cents (\$80.00) each ..... 1,440.00

ITEM NO. 8.  
 18 cast iron body, bronze stemmed, fire hydrants, for a depth of trench of six (6) feet, for six (6) inch connection to watermain, with five (5) inch valve opening, with six (6) inch cast iron body, bronze mounted auxiliary gate valve, with cast iron box and cover, with two (2) two and one-half (2 1/2) inch Highland Park pattern hose connection, exact steam hose connection; including all excavation, calking, joints with lead and jute, testing backfill with earth, flushing the backfill, and one-quarter (1/4) of a cubic yard of gravel around each hydrant drip, and removal of all surplus excavated materials, set complete in place at One Hundred Forty Dollars No Cents (\$140.00) each ..... 2,520.00

ITEM NO. 9.  
 3 connections to existing eight (8) inch water main in Clavey Road, for proposed water pipes, consisting of the necessary excavation, cutting said eight (8) inch water main, placing the eight (8) inch by six (6) inch tee provided under Item No. 3 to line and grade, and calking joints with lead and jute, all backfilling, flushing the backfill, testing and removal of all surplus excavated materials, complete at Forty Three Dollars No Cents (\$43.00) each ..... 86.00

ITEM NO. 10.  
 4 connections to twelve (12) inch water main in Ridge Road, for fire hydrants, consisting of the necessary excavation, cutting said twelve (12) inch water main, placing the twelve (12) inch by six (6) inch tee provided under Item No. 3 to line and grade, and calking joints with lead and jute, all backfilling, flushing the backfill, testing and removal of all surplus excavated materials, complete at Forty Three Dollars No Cents (\$43.00) each ..... 172.00

TOTAL AMOUNT OF BID, \$12,404.00
