FOR CAMP MERRY DAYS**

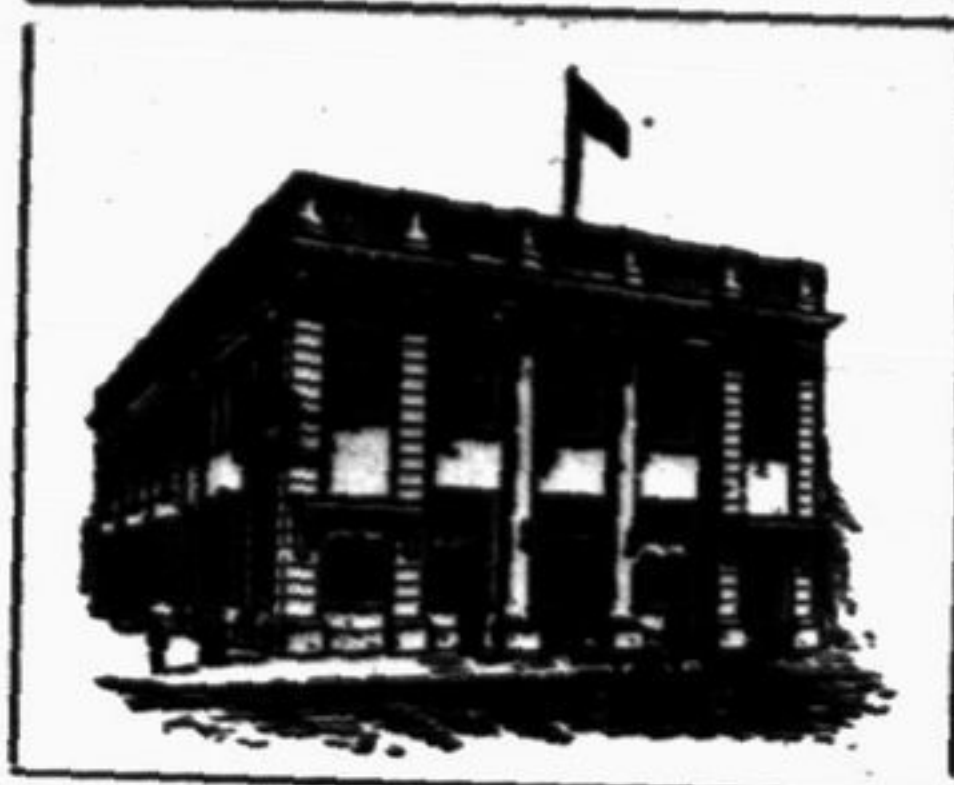
