Petition . Filed Indicates Total of 300,000, Personal Property, Report

July 8, left an estate of \$300,000, all personal property, according to a petition for probate of his will which was filed in the Probate court. Judge Martin C. Decker set the hearing for July 30. Letters of administration to collect were issued to the Northern Trust company. The administrator was authorized to sell stocks.
