CULINARY HINTS

Mutton and Tomato Pie
Cover the bottom of a buttered baking dish with bread crumbs, over a layer of sliced tomatoes, then slices of cold roast mutton.

Baked Savory Rice
Blanch 1 cup rice, drain, rinse with cold water, cover with 1 qt. boiling water and return to the fire. Add 1 teaspoon salt, juice of 1 lemon and cook for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Lemon Cream Sauce
To 1/2 cup cream, whipped, add 4 tablespoons sugar and 3 tablespoons lemon juice. Mix and pour over the salad.

Apple Sauce Cake
1 cup sugar, 1/2 cup unsalted shortening, 1 1/4 cups unsweetened apple sauce, 2 teaspoons soda, 1 1/4 teaspoons salt, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg, 1/2 teaspoon cloves, 2 cups pastry flour, 1/2 cup seedless raisins, 1/2 cup chopped walnut-meats, 1/4 cup butter, 1 cup powdered sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Frosting
Cream 3 tablespoons butter, add 2 cups powdered sugar, 2 tablespoons pure cream, and three drops of vanilla extract.
