> ALASKAN REINDEER MEAT OF FOOD VALUE

Survey Shows it to Be Rich in Protein, Says Report in Magazine

To determine the value of Alaskan reindeer meat for food, samples have been officially tested recently for chemical composition and nutritive value. It was found to possess high portein, low fat, and comparatively low moisture. The test is valuable in connection with the commercial introduction into the United States of reindeer as an article of food, as well as for the information of Alaskan natives, for the information of Alaskan natives, for whom reindeer meat provides a staple article of food.
