

### REPORT MERGER OF 2 WAUKEGAN BANKS

TOOK EFFECT LAST WEEK

#### Waukegan State Takes Over Peoples Banks and Assumes Liabilities; Forming Strong Union

The Waukegan State bank last week took over the Peoples State bank of that city, assumed all liabilities of the Peoples State bank and took over its assets. The transaction was in effect a merger of the banks and the merged banks will operate now as the Waukegan State bank. The capital stock of each bank is \$100,000.

The announcement made was that the stockholders of the Peoples bank had sold their holdings outright to the Waukegan State bank and the Peoples bank goes out of existence and its president, C. E. Staley, retires.

Carl W. Stenger, head of the Waukegan State bank assumed charge of the merged bank. Prior to the merger State Auditor Oscar Nelson examined the books and records of the Peoples bank and found everything in such shape as to easily permit the merger. He was present in the merged bank Thursday morning as the Waukegan State took charge.

#### Move Into New Location

The Waukegan State bank will give up its quarters in the old Yager building at 309 Washington street as soon as the safety deposit boxes can be moved to the bank's new location. The personnel of both banks will be retained as they are at present, pending the adjustment of the working force.

Through this merger Waukegan now stands with three sound and strong financial institutions located in three beautiful new bank homes and brings about a banking situation that is highly desirable.

### N. W. RAILROAD STARTS INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT

#### Extensive Tract on East Side of Tracks in Waukegan to be Developed

Actual realization of the long discussed plan of the Chicago and North Western railroad to establish a great industrial district on the freight line of that railroad near the western boundaries of Waukegan became a certainty last week when work on the district was started by a force of employes of the railroad company.

The establishment of a large industrial district will mean much to the city as it will afford many acres of ideal sites for industrial concerns as well as suitable trackage space.

It is also expected that the project will pave the way for immediate annexation of the territory by the city, as industrial concerns will not accept locations in the district unless the area is a part of the city or that its annexation is considered as certain.

The district is to be located along the east side of the tracks of the railroad company between Washington and Belvidere street roads.

### USE BURIAL LOT FOR 83 YEARS; NO TITLE

#### Peculiar Situation Revealed by Petition to Waukegan City Council

Disclosures that although their family has used a lot in Oakwood cemetery, Waukegan, as a burial ground for more than 83 years, and it contains the remains of half a dozen forebears, still the title is vested in the name of another person or his heirs, has aroused the surviving members of the Howe family, once prosperous and numerous in Waukegan, to action.

A petition that the city council of Waukegan grant the Howe family a full title to the lot was presented to the Waukegan city council last week. It was signed by Mary Clinton Howe

and it asked that title to the property be vested in the person of John Howe of St. Joseph, Mich., the sole heir of the members of the family buried in the plot.

The petition states that the first burial was made in the lot in 1845 when John Howe, Jr., infant son of Capt. and Mrs. John Randolph Howe was interred there. Capt. John Randolph Howe was buried there in 1856. This was followed by the burial of a number of other members of the family.

Despite this title to the lot was granted one Jacob Ellis more than 50 years ago and it is believed that he or his heirs still hold title. How it was obtained has not been determined but it is believed to have been the result of an error.
