SEES PROSPERITY IF HOOVER ELECTED

VAUCLAIN BACKS G. O. P.

Locomotive Magnate Makes Significant Statement; Thinks Country On Eve of Big Advancement

A pledge to gather for the Republican national ticket all the support he could muster was voiced by Sam uel M. Vauclain, president of the Baldwin Locomotive Works, Philadelphia, almost simultaneouly with the nomination of Alfred E. Smith, Governor of New York, as Democratic candidate for the Presidency. Mr. Vauclain's announcement is regarded in political and manufacturing circles as significant.

Mr. Vauclain's announcement made it plain that he regards Herbert Hoover as the leader who is best able to lead the Nation to its greatest peak of prosperity, which, he declared, would not be at the expense of workers' wages. His announcement followed an address on the occasion of the removal of the Baldwin Locomotive Works for Philadelphia to Eddy-
