The plan worked out by the secretary of public works is simple, but conceived on broad lines.' The article then goes on to say that the plan consists of a central highway extending the length of the island, with connecting highways extending from the main stem to all the cities and ports of Cuba. This is in accordance with the presidents' policy of developing the agriculture and commerce of the republic and stimulating the tourist movement to Cuba. When completed, the main highway will be about 700 miles long, which, in conjunction with the 4,769 miles of branch roads, will make a grand total of 5,469 miles of modern highways, to be constructed at an estimated cost of \$75,000,000.

"A maximum of five per cent, has been fixed for grades, and in the majority of cases three per cent will not be exceeded. Along level stretches the minimum radius of curves will be 650, and on mountain roads 325 feet; but in no case will a curve radius be less than 150 feet.
