**MORRIS WESTERN IS REPORTED IMPROVING**

**Badly Hurt When Car Crashes Last Week; Two Men With Him Killed**

Two persons were killed and three were seriously injured when two automobiles driven and owned by Waukegan men collided on Sheridan road, two and one half miles south of Kenosha, at 1 o'clock last Thursday morning.

Morris Western, manager of the North Shore Cemetery, driver of one of the machines, a son of John Western, was taken to the Kenosha hospital with a fracture of the skull. While his condition was critical, he is now reported recovering.

Harry Dennison, 2909 Elisha avenue, Zion and Charles Irving, 4217 Fifth avenue, Kenosha, both occupants of the Western machine, were killed. Norbett Bonn, of 4323 Sixth avenue, Kenosha, and Kenneth Mowrey, 1800 Fifty-sixth street, Kenosha, also companions of Western are in a serious condition in the Kenosha hospital.

Six occupants of the other machine emerged from the crash which wrecked their Ford sedan, without injury.

The accident was due it is believed to loss of control of his Lincoln automobile by Western as he was moving around a slight curve in the road, says the Waukegan Sun.

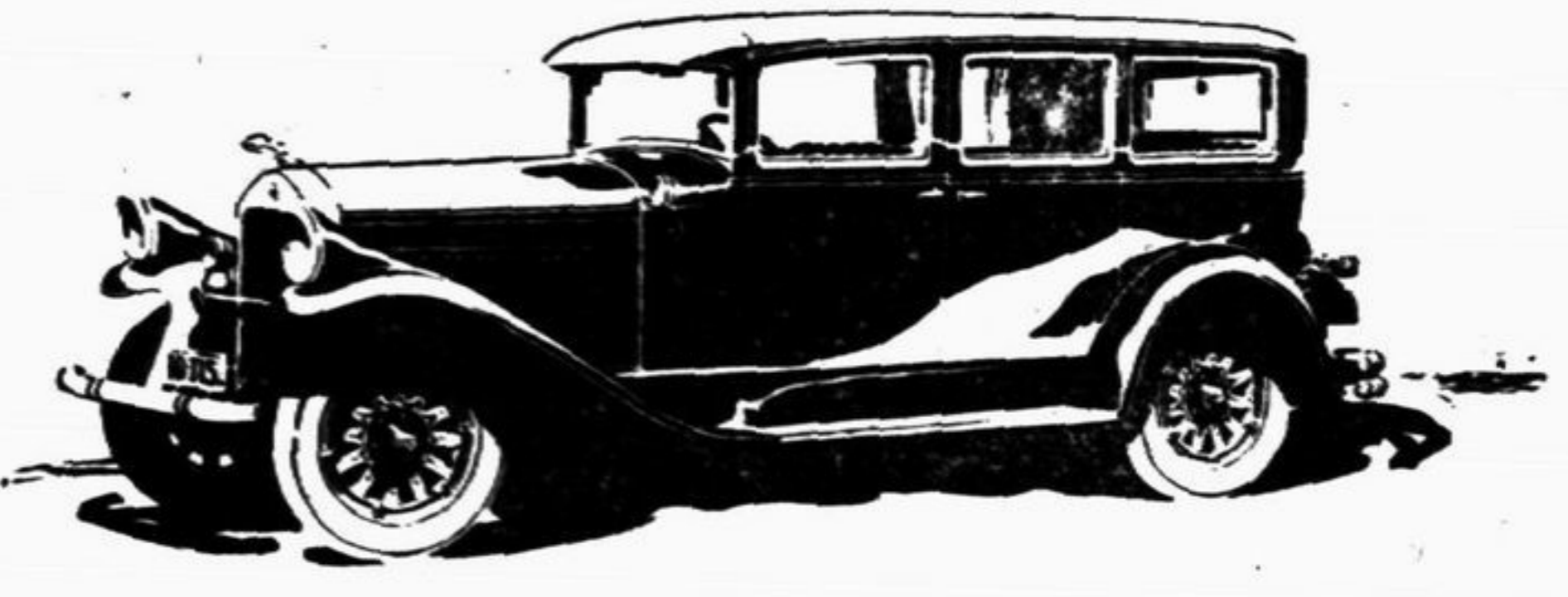
