OVER 73 MILLIONS

For United States and Hawaii, According to Plan for 1929-1931

A total of \$73,125,000 will be available to the United States and Hawaii from the Federal government for road building during each of the years 1929, 1930 and 1931, according to a bulletin issued by the Chicago Motor club, based on a report of the American Road Builders' association. This means a total of \$219,375,000 contributed by the government for highways, and the states must spend a minimum of \$198,049,992 on Federalaid roads during the three years in order to take advantage of their federal appropriation.




