Pear Butter

1 peck pears 5 lbs. sugar 1 cup apple jelly 1 tablespoon cinnamon

1 teaspoon cloves

1 teaspoon grated lemon rind

Wash and peel pears and cook until soft. Press through colander or ricer to remove cores and take out lumps. Mix with the sugar and rind and jelly and place in oven 300 degrees-slow oven-until the desired thickness. Stir in the spices and pour into sterilized jars and seal at once.

Pickled Peaches

1% cup strong vinegar 2 cups sugar

4 ounce stick cinnamen 1/4 lbs. peaches, weighed after removing skins

Mix the vinegar, sugar and cinnamon and boil together 20 minutes. To remove the peach skins, drop into boiling water for two minutes, then place in cold water. The skins may then be easily removed. Place the peaches in the hot syrup and simmer gently until the fruit is tender and may be easily pierced. Drain from the syrup and stick four or five cloves in each peach. Cook the syrup until thick and pour over peaches in jars which have been sterilized. Seal at


