In accordance with the prescribed commandment in the Bible, Reform Judaism devotes one day to the observance of this holiday. With the celebration of this solemn festival which carries a signal message to both Jew and mankind at large, this will open the year of 5689 of the Jewish calendar.

Far back in the earliest times, the Hebrew New Year began in autumn with the opening of the agricultural year of the Jewish people in Palestine a system adopted by all Semitic peoples. From ancient times on, the beginning of the economic year was celebrated in some special way On this day there was to be a holy convocation of the people, trumpets were to be blown, and special sacrifices were to be offered at the altar of the Jerusalem Temple. 
