

**QUARTERLY REPORT ON COUNTY ROADS**

**PROGRESS ON HIGHWAYS**

**Engineer Lobdell Tells Board of Supervisor What Has Been Done During Summer**

County Highway Supt. Ralph M. Lobdell in a quarterly report read at the opening session of the board of supervisors last week told in detail of the progress made in getting rights-of-way for various routes in Lake county. He stated that contracts for the paving of four routes had been let during the summer months. In one case two property owners have refused to give right-of-way needed and it is planned to start condemnation suits against them this week. The complete report of County Highway Superintendent Lobdell follows:

"I wish to report that the following progress has been made in Lake county highway matters since your last regular session.

**Report Made**

"Lake county section 36-15d, the Round Lake-Long Lake road, has been paved and I expect that the shoulder and entrance culvert work will be completed in time for final inspection and acceptance before the end of this month.

"In accordance with your action at the June session, I have kept one man available for assistance to the townships in securing rights-of-way for State Bond routes, with the result that, with the assistance of the County right-of-way committee and the cooperation of the township officials, the contracts for the following routes have been awarded.

- "Route 172—Libertyville to Gurnee.
- "Route 176—Mundelein to Wauconda.
- "Route 176—Wauconda to Burton's Bridge.
- "Route 59—Volo to Willey's Corners.

"On the section of Route 176 from Mundelein to Wauconda there are two owners—V. D. Kimball and George Duberville—with whom an equitable settlement could not be effected, and it will therefore be necessary to resort to condemnation proceedings to secure the required right-of-way. Preparations for these condemnations have been under way for some time and the cases will be filed in court this week.

**On Route 176**  
 "On the section of Route 176 from Wauconda to Burton's Bridge, all right-of-way in Lake county has been secured except the Gilbert tract and condemnation proceedings will be resorted to as soon as the Kimball and Duberville cases are under way.

"On Route 59 the contract was awarded to Willey's Corner pending the settlement of right-of-way with Martha Sheehan or the establishment of a connection with Grand avenue pavement over another route.

"Paving on the first section of Route 176 was started at Mundelein and has progressed to a point approximately a mile and a half west of Ivanhoe.

"No construction work has been done on the other section of Route 176 but grading will very likely be started before the end of this month.

"Pavement has been laid on Route 172 from Gurnee to Belvidere road

and I think it reasonably certain that this route will be available for use before the end of the year.

"Bids have recently been received on Route 57—Tossville to Highland Park—and Route 173—Zion to Rosecrans. We have started to secure right-of-way for this section of Route 173 and will probably get started on Route 57 right-of-way early next week.

"Surveys are now being made on the remainder of Route 173 through Lake county, also on Routes 68 and 59-A.

"Right-of-way for the Grant township county aid bridge has been secured and we will advertise for bids to be received early in October in order that the work may be done with the least possible inconvenience to traffic.

"Contracts have been awarded for the drainage of the Lake County hospital drives and the work is nearing completion.

"Proposals covering the concrete work incidental to the widening of the drives will be received on Friday of this week and as soon as this work has been completed will proceed with the actual widening of the driveway entrances.

"We have made several much needed improvements in the way of widening to drainage structures and the

extension of culverts on the State Aid roads and we plan to erect guard fence and other protective devices for the greater safety to traffic.

"The output of the county crusher outfit continues to be of exceptionally high grade for gravel road construction and has been the subject of much favorable comment by the townships who have used it.

"We are attempting to place the State Aid road surfaces in condition to give greater satisfaction to traffic than ever before and we will attempt to get the roads through the winter and spring months in better shape from the standpoint of service to traffic than has been possible formerly."

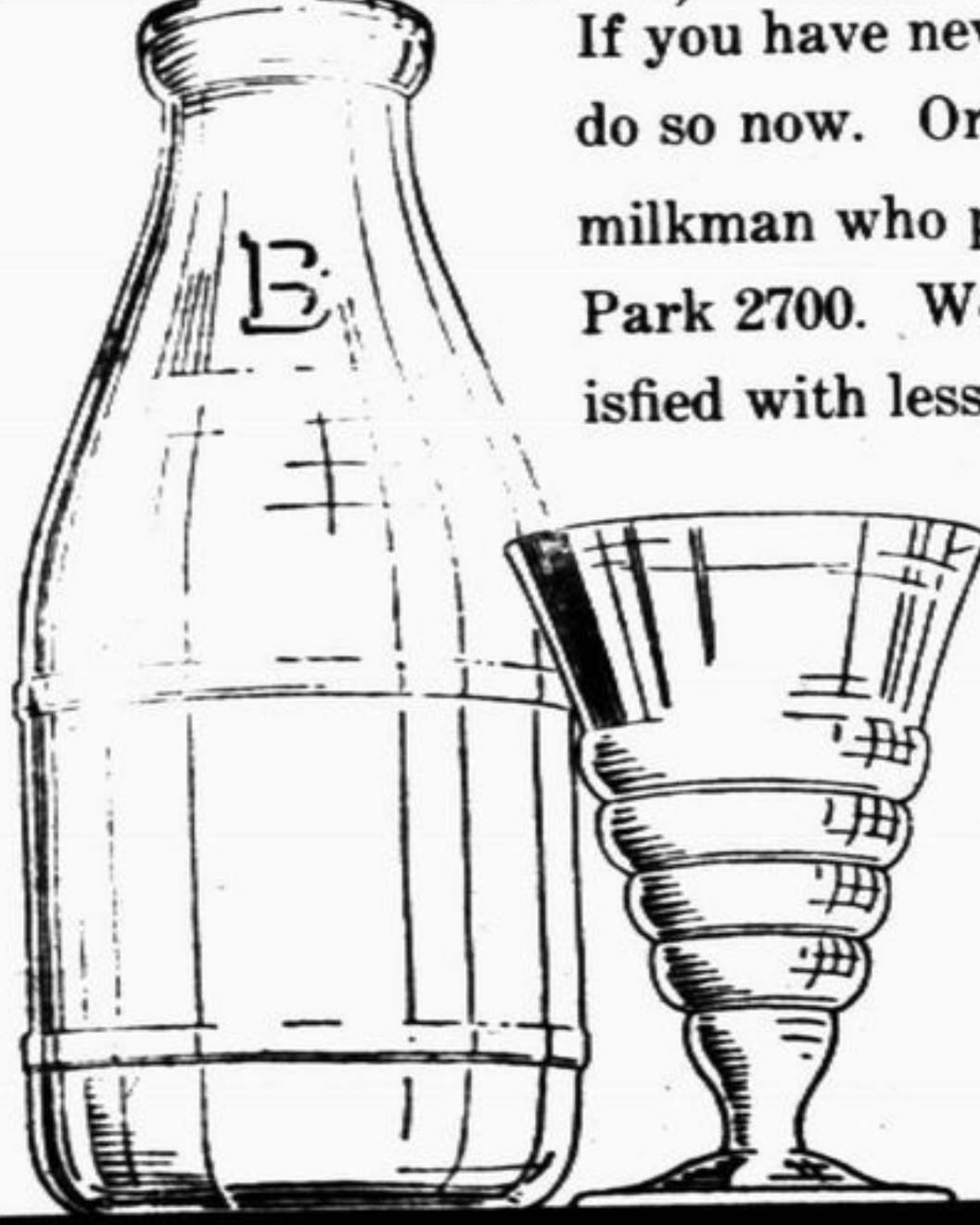

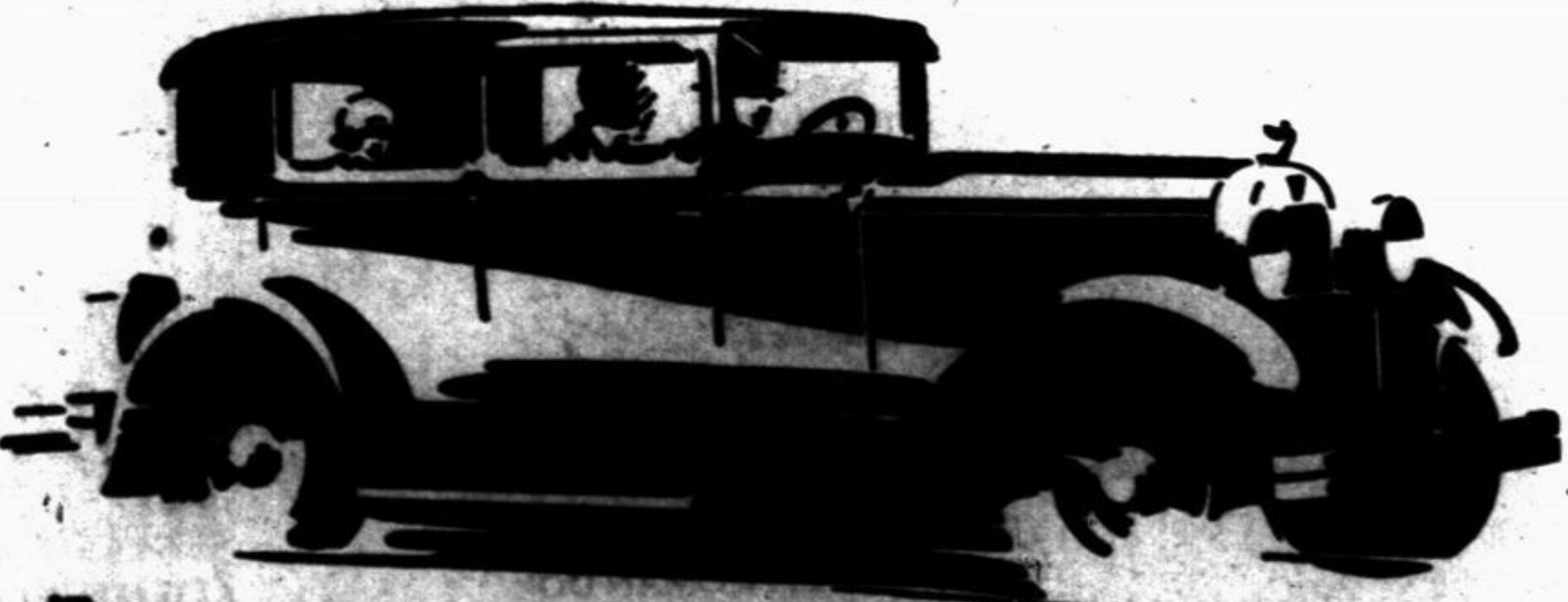
