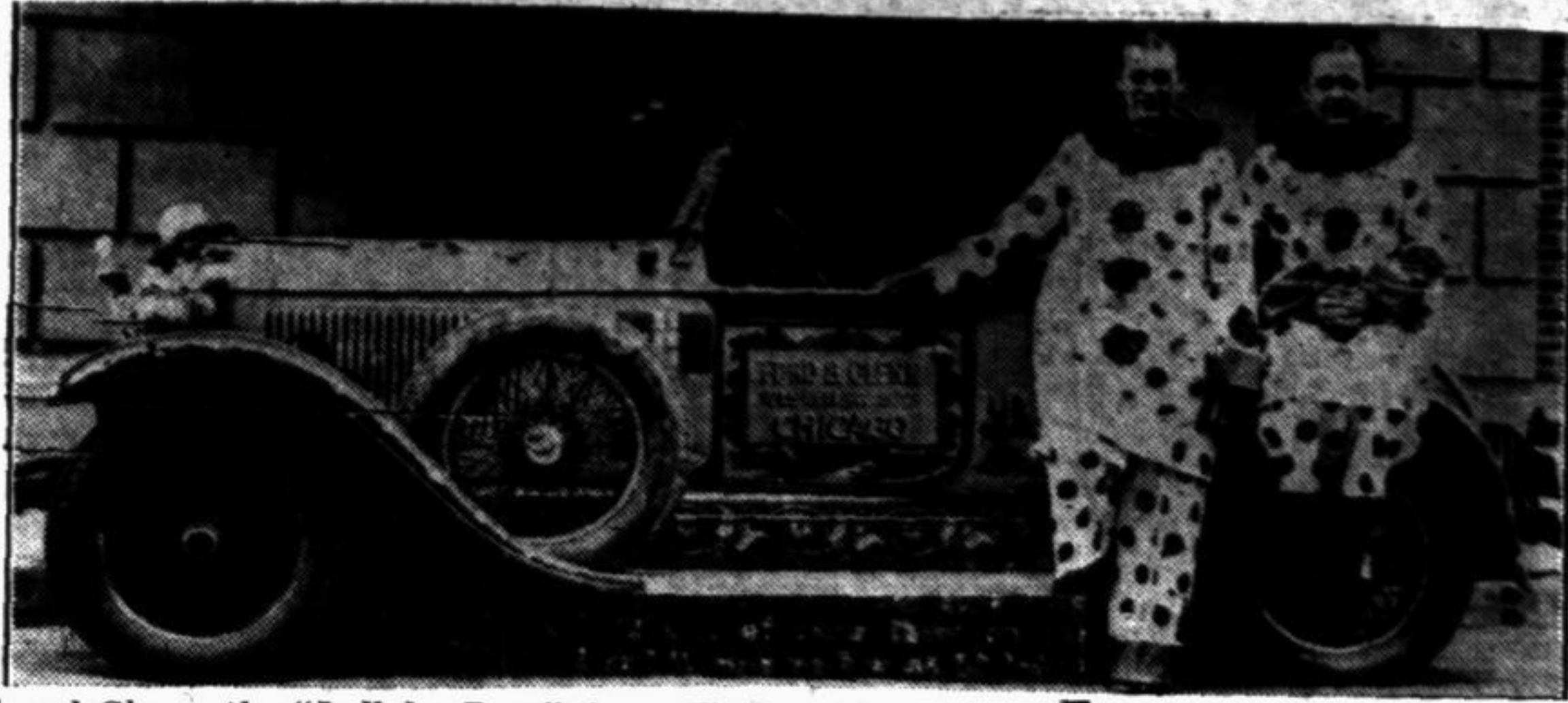

TEACHING RANKS FIRST AS WOMAN'S VOCATION

Questionnaire Survey Indicates That It Is Most Often Chosen

Teaching ranks first as a profession with modern American womanhood, if the results of a questionnaire answered by twenty-five young women students chosen at random in New York university classes, can be taken as a fair sample of preference.

Banking was last on the list of prospective business ventures chosen by the young women, according to the report as made in *The American Magazine*. In addition to asking the young women what they wished to do, their preference as to what they wanted to be was asked. To this a majority described the sort of person they admire and would like to live with and said that they would like to be such a person.

The tabulated results of the questionnaire as to kind of work they preferred follows: Teaching, ten; librarians, four; retail selling and buying, for department stores, three; home making, marriage, seven; banking, one.

THREE ANCIENT MAYAN CITIES DISCOVERED

Field Museum Expedition Finds Them in British Honduras; on West Coast

Discovery of three ancient Mayan cities in British Honduras with relics of a "distinct and peculiar civilization," was announced here by John

Field Museum of Chicago, on his arrival at New Orleans from Belize.

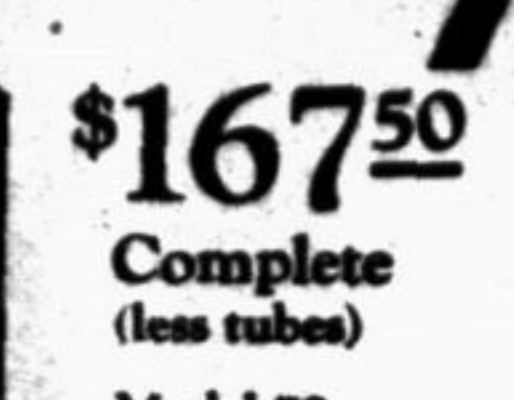
The discovery was followed by five months of excavation which the archaeologists carried on with the aid of native Indians only. Next January Mr. Thompson will return with assistants from Chicago to continue the work which he estimates will require three years.

Some of the relics obtained in the excavations were exhibited in New Orleans, but Mr. Thompson said he surrendered many to the native government as part of an agreement under which he was permitted to explore. The three cities, he said, are on the west coast, near the border of Guatemala.
