

JUDGE PERSONS IS HEAD OF PYTHIANS

STATE GRD CHANCELLOR

Elected at Annual Meeting of Grand Lodge Last Week in Springfield; Friends Are Pleased

Members of the Knights of Pythias of Waukegan received official word Thursday afternoon that County Judge Perry L. Persons was elected grand chancellor of the Illinois Knights of Pythias at the afternoon session of the convention Wednesday. The convention is being held at Springfield and Judge Persons and James S. Jamieson are the Waukegan delegates at the affair.

The election of Judge Persons as head of the Knights of Pythias of Illinois is a great honor as this organization is among the largest and most influential fraternal orders in the state.

Judge Persons last year was elected vice grand chancellor. He has been active in the Waukegan branch of the Knights of Pythias for a great many years. He was elected to an office in the state organization for the first time in 1927 and has moved up an office each year for the past six years.
