They said the same things about LINCOLN

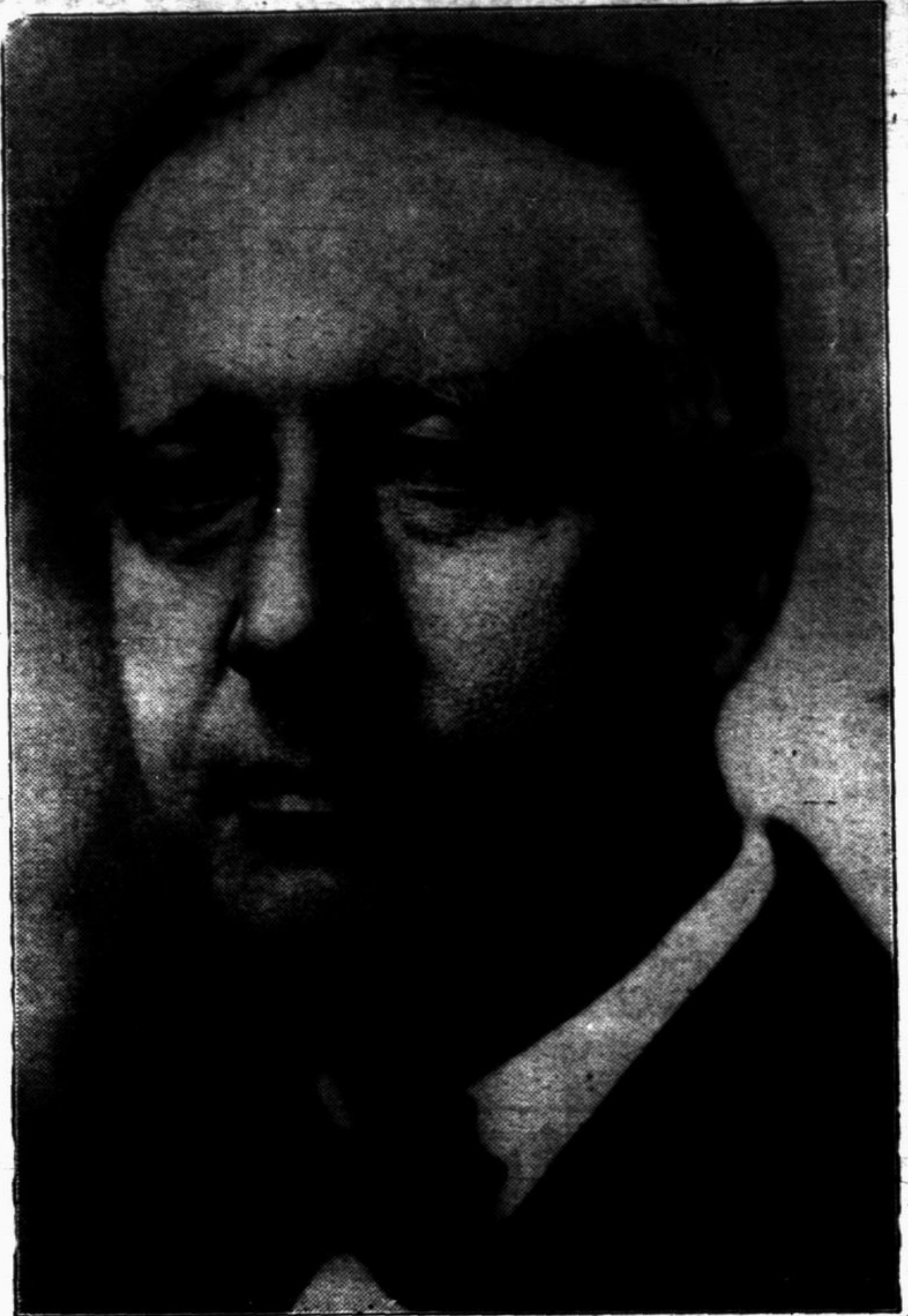
