And there is more to these people than is at first apparent. The entire action takes place in the hall of the old inn, a most picturesque place with its low and heavily beamed ceiling, its fireplace and dim lights. And the characters in their authentic early nineteenth century costumes will fit into the setting and blend with their surroundings in a manner which will bring out the very flavor of the story.

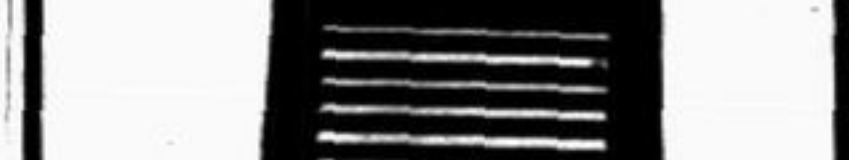
