It being shown by the affidavit of ownership
on file in this office of the Clerk of the
Court that JESSIE A. PAYNE, one of the
persons made defendant herein is a non-
resident of the State of Illinois and it
appearing that there are certain other
persons made defendant under the title "All
whom it may concern" and the Court by order
entered herein having directed that notice
be given to the said JESSIE A. PAYNE,
defendant and defendant designated "ALL
WHOM IT MAY CONCERN" and it appearing
that certain persons named as defendants cannot
be found and their places of residence is not
known and cannot be obtained so that service
cannot be made upon them, THEREFORE
notice is hereby given to the said JESSIE
A. PAYNE and to the said "ALL WHOM
IT MAY CONCERN" that the Highland Park
East Park District, a Municipal Corporation,
heretofore filed its petition in the Clerk's
Office of the County Court of Lake County,
Illinois, praying for the ascertainment of
just compensation to be made for private
property to be taken or damaged for a local
improvement consisting of the acquiring and
improving of certain property in Block 1
First Addition to Ravinia Highlands and in
Block 1 Ravinia Highlands, located in Sec-
tions 25 and 26, Township 43 North, Range
12 East of the Third Principal Meridian in
Lake County, Illinois, for park purposes (all
as a combined improvement) and all located
in the Highland Park East Park District
Lake County, Illinois, and what property will
be benefited thereby and the amount of such
benefit; that commissioners were appointed
by said Court to investigate and report the
just compensation to be made for private
property to be taken or damaged for said
improvement and also what real estate will
be benefited by such improvement and the
amount of such benefit to each parcel of
land benefited thereby and that the com-
missioners duly made their report and assess-
ment roll, said assessment being divided into
five installments and bearing six per cent
interest to raise the cost of the said im-
provement including the estimate of value
and damage and duly filed their report and
assessment roll in the office of the Clerk
of said County Court on the 29th day
of October, A.D. 1928; that the esti-
mated cost of such improvement including
the estimate of value and damage is the sum

Take Game in Fast and Close Contest; Brief Report of Exciting Battle
A record crowd of about eight hundred fans witnesses a hard and thrilling game between two of the strongest teams on the North Shore. There was little to choose between the strength of the two teams, except that in the last quarter Highwood's weight and power began to tell. In the first quarter Deerfield kicked off to Highwood. Deerfield held, but Shannons punt was fumbled and Highwood recovered. Then a pass to Allens scored Highwood's first touchdown. In the rest of the quarter and in the second quarter there was no scoring, but in the third quarter a long pass and a thirty yard run by Lutz gave Deerfield six points. In the fourth quarter a blocked punt gave Highwood the ball on Deerfield's seven yard line, but Deerfield held for downs. They punted out of danger, but this time Highwood scored. Cronkhite made the touchdown and then drop kicked the extra point. Then in an attempt to tie the score Deerfield opened up with a long passing attack, but were stopped when a pass was intercepted.
