ested declare. At times it has been patched up temporarily, but always it soon reverts to its former condition, with numerous bad holes which have caused innumerable complaints and not a little damage to traffic, it is stated.

Now that practically all other main roads along the north shore have been improved and are in good shape, it is believed timely to insist that the government take care of this stretch within the army post. It is believed that it would be to the interest of the war department to improve this road as it would tend to deflect much traffic, from Sheridan road through the Fort and lessen congestion on that road and in that way prove a safety factor, as well as a benefit to the post.

Citizens May Aid

The Highland Park and Highwood Chambers of Commerce and the Lake Forest Kiwanis club are to be praised for their interest in the matter, and it is suggested that citizens of these towns also might help the matter along by writing to the congressman and senators regarding this road problem.

The Highland Park Chamber of Commerce sent a letter to these officials some time ago, and last week the Highwood Chamber of Commerce approved the following letter, which has been mailed to Congressman Chindblom:

Our organization has received many complaints from local residents and transient motorists the past three years regarding the condition of the road running through Fort Sheridan along the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee railroad tracks from Shannon's corner in Highwood to the North Gate.

The condition of this road has caused thousands of dollars worth of damage and the Highwood Chamber of Commerce, representing the community asks your kind assistance in having this road widened to forty (40) feet and paved.

Inasmuch as this is a prominent thoroughfare between Chicago and Waukegan, your kindness in asserting your influence will be greatly appreciated not only by local residents but by the public at large.

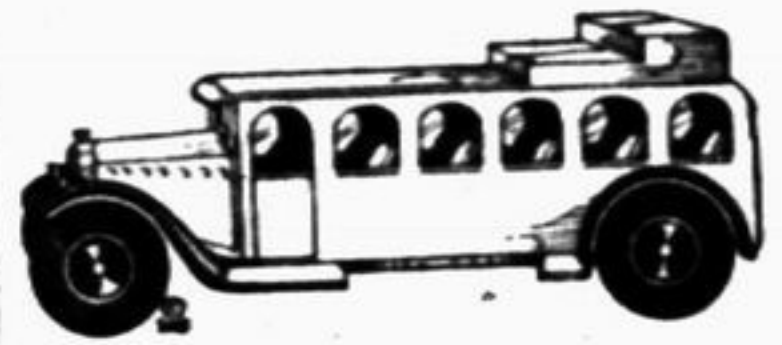
