That America, far from having a monopoly on present-day criminal activities, lags far behind other nations in the horror and frequency of crime is the contention of Charles Woodhull, writing in the November Welfare Magazine, a publication issued by the Illinois Department Public Welfare. The article, Phases of Foreign Crime, is the first of series in which the peculiarities and causes of crime in various countries will be studied.
