#### Supervisors Approve Sheriff's Request That He Be Allowed Half Dozen Riders

The Lake county highway motorcycle corps of six men is to be retained permanently.

The board of supervisors Thursday morning adopted a resolution presented by the finance committee composed of Arthur W. Vercoe, chairman, Emil Ficke, H. C. W. Meyer, and John D. Thomas, recommending that Sheriff Lawrence A. Doolittle be allowed to keep his entire force of mon torcycle officers on duty throughout the year, rather than just during the summer months. The vote on this

resolution was unanimous. The finance committee held a session for over an hour prior to the board meeting at which time the sheriff's matter was discussed fully and turnkeys are Thomas Tyrrell and decision made to recommend the motorcycle officers be kept. Every angle of the situation was considered at
