AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SALE BY THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK OF LOTS 19, 20 AND 21 IN BLOCK 7, IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the City of Highland Park is the owner of certain real estate and buildings thereon located, known and described as follows:

Lots nineteen (19), twenty (20) and twenty-one (21), in Block seven (7), in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois;

which said property has been used by the said city for city hall purposes and is now being used for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the said city has purchased certain other property upon which it is about to construct a new city hall; and

WHEREAS, in the unanimous opinion of the Council of said city, the said above described property will be no longer necessary, appropriate or required for the use of the said city or profitable to or its longer retention be for the best interests of said city; and

WHEREAS, the city desires to sell the said property to the highest and best bidder upon the terms hereinafter set forth, retaining possession of said property until the new proposed city hall be ready for occupancy by said city; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois:

Section 1. That said property shall be sold to the highest and best bidder who shall submit a bid upon the following terms:

1. The bidder shall make a cash payment of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars upon the purchase and upon the acceptance of said purchase price shall be due and payable at the time when possession shall be delivered by the city to the buyer.
2. Possession shall be delivered by the city to the buyer as soon as the new city hall hereinafter mentioned shall be ready for occupancy by said city.
3. That the city clerk be and he is hereby authorized and directed to publish a notice in the Highland Park Press, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, advertising the said property for sale. Such notice shall be so published once in each week for four successive weeks, the first publication to be not less than thirty (30) days before the date

Such notice shall offer the property for sale to the highest and best bidder therefor under the terms and conditions in this ordinance set forth, and shall contain an accurate description of said property, the purposes for which it is used and at what meeting and at what hour the bids will be opened and considered, and shall advertise for bids therefor. All such bids shall be opened only at a regular meeting of the City Council held at the Council Chamber at 7:45 o'clock P. M. on Monday, the 28th day of January A. D. 1929, and shall be accepted only upon a vote of three-fourths of the members of the council; provided, however, that the said Council may by a majority vote reject any and all bids. CAR OPERATION IS CHEAPER ON CEMENT

Motor Vehicles Cost Less When Run on Paved Roads Motor Club Head Says

"Motor vehicles can be operated on well-paved roads at from three to five cents less than on dirt roads," says Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club. He based the statement on figures secured from the research department of the American Automobile association, with which the club is affiliated.

"Assuming that the average motorist drives his car 10,000 miles per year on well-paved roads, his maintenance costs are \$300 less than if he had driven that distance over dirt," continued Mr. Hayes. "His saving was three cents a mile. It has been found that school busses can be operated on smooth highways at five cents less per mile than on unpaved roads.

"These statistics, carefully gathered by the national motoring body, should be sufficient to convince the most skeptical that good roads pay a definite monetary return, and in that respect are like gilt edge securities. On top of this return, we may add increased property values in the territory of the improved road, and the immense saving effected by expediting traffic."
