ANNUAL MEETING OF SOCIOLOGICAL BODY

Seven Hundred Members of the American Sociological Society in Chicago

More than seven hundred American sociologists and educators are meeting in Chicago from December 26 to 29 for the twenty-third annual session of the American Sociological society. The majority of meetings will be at the Hotel Congress, and will be directed by Dr. John M. Gillette, North Dakota.

Problems of the American rural community will be the main topic of discussion, although attention will be paid to problems of the American family, the community, and educational sociology. The delegates will be welcomed by William J. Bogan, superintendent of Chicago schools.
