Village Election in Deerfield April 16th; Two Tickets in Field

Two tickets are in the field in the Deerfield village campaign which will culminate in the annual village election on Tuesday, April 16. James J. Hood heads the People's Ticket for president, and William W. Geary is the candidate for president on the People's Economy ticket. The complete list of candidates on the two tickets is reported as follows:

People's ticket — for president, Edward W. Selig, Edward F. Segert, Albert C. C. Timm; for two year term; for trustee for one year term, Harry T. Clavey.

People's Economy ticket—for president, William W. Geary; for village clerk, Clarence H. Huhn; for trustees, Seth N. Gooder, Lincoln Pettis, Dr. Walter B. Metcalf, all for two year term; Fred J. LeBahn, for one year term.

Township Election to Be Held Tuesday, Apr. 2

Township election, for the purpose of electing two constables, two justice of the peace, and two library trustees, will be held in the town hall, Tuesday, April 2. Henry Peterson and Peter Leist are running for constables, Peter Duffy and Ray Clavey for justice of the peace and C. M. Christenson and Harry E. Wing for library trustees, with no opposition.

Polls will be open at 7 a. m. and will close at 5 p. m.
