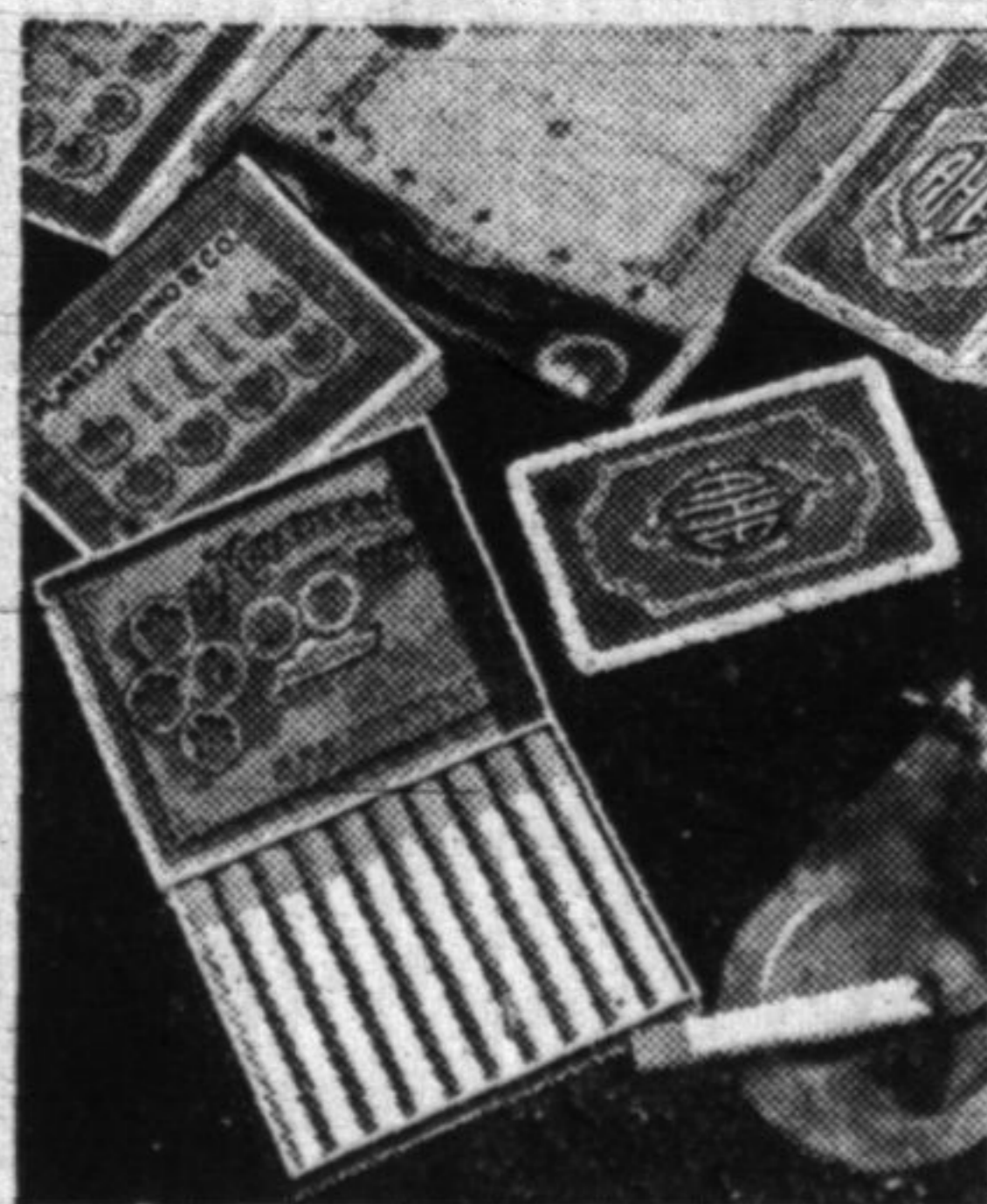

Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Matters

Mrs. Mary Sowles, mother of Dr. C. W. Sowles of Waukegan, and who resided on the same farm in Freemont township on which she was born 82 years ago, passed away last week.

Libertyville township will have another representative on the board of supervisors at the June meeting if the plans of the Union party, which held a caucus recently, are carried out.

William Bedinger, a resident of Waukegan for 65 years and long well known in the community, passed away at his home last week after an illness of three years.

Frank J. Herman, his wife, Marie and bartender, Harry Kolin, were enjoined last week from selling or manufacturing liquor at their hotel on Loon Lake through a petition filed by State's Attorney A. V. Smith before County Judge P. L. Persons.

William P. Carey, prominent Waukegan attorney and banker, died last week in St. Joseph's sanitarium at Wedron, Ill., where he had been confined for a year. His death came after an illness of about three years.

John W. Thalman, superintendent of the Waukegan township high school, will serve during the coming year in that capacity following his re-election by the high school board last week.

Edward Conrad of Waukegan, deputy coroner for many years under Coroner J. L. Taylor, last week announced his candidacy for the office of police magistrate to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Walter A. Taylor. Mr. Conrad is not new in politics as he at one time held the office of township supervisor in Waukegan.
