Easter Sunday, as in all churches, will be a notable day with us. It will open with a "Sunrise" meeting at 6 a. m., in the church led by Mr. Arthur W. Vercoe, who for some years has had this meeting in charge, and always has an inspiring message for those who attend. This meeting is open to everybody. At 7 o'clock a simple breakfast will be served in the church by the young ladies, to which everyone is welcome: silver offering.

At 9:30 the Sunday school will shorten its lesson period so as to give time for a special Easter program; it is hoped that we may have an unusually large attendance.

The regular church service at 10:45 will be made most inspiring by the special music by the enlarged choir which will render several anthems. The pastor will give the last of the sermons on the Creed which furnishes a most appropriate theme for the day, "I believe in—the Life Everlasting." The church will be beautifully decorated and an attendance that will fill the church is expected.

The concluding one of the series of Lenten services being held by the church at Odd Fellows' hall will take place Sunday night at 8 o'clock, and will be largely of a musical nature. The pastor will speak briefly at this service, describing his visit to the two reputed tombs of Jesus, the one in the Holy Sepulchre and the other the so-called "Garden Tomb" and will show a very few slides taken by him at each place. This will form a most

fitting close to the Easter day services.
