Wants State to Pay for City Pavement

Petition that the city of Waukegan be compensated by the state for the paving or resurfacing of streets which form a part of the state highways routed through that city is to be presented in the state legislature by Representative Lee McDonough at the request of Nicholas Keller, commissioner of streets and public improvements.

Following the announcement that a similar bill asking for a refund of \$1,005,000 covering cost of paving on three state routes within East St. Louis has been filed in the state legislature, Commissioner Keller is of the belief that Waukegan also has the right to enter the same sort of a measure. Other cities in this section are also interested.

Hearings in Criminal Cases Delayed 2 Weeks

Hearings on criminal cases might be delayed for almost two weeks due to a heavy civil call in circuit court, it was learned last week-end. Circuit Judge Claire C. Edwards and City Judge Theodore Forby, of Zion, have spent all of this week in circuit court hearing civil suits and unless a number are swept from the docket in the next week there will be little opportunity for States Attorney A. V. Smith to force trials on the indicted by April 1, it was said.

Things to Cook

Beef Kromeskies

1½ tablespoons butter
1½ tablespoons flour
1 cup milk
1 pint cold beef
1 teaspoon salt
Dash of pepper
1 tablespoon parsley
1 teaspoon onion juice
Melt the butter; add the flour, then the milk gradually, stirring to prevent lumps. Cook until it thickens; mix in the chopped beef and seasonings and set aside to cool. When cool form into small cylinders, dip each in fritter batter and fry in smoking hot fat.

Creamed Turnips and Onions

12 small white onions
6 medium sized white turnips
3 tablespoons fat
½ cup vegetable liquor
3 tablespoons flour
1¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon pepper
1¼ cups milk
½ tablespoons minced parsley
Skin the onions, and pare and dice the turnips. Place both together in a saucepan and cover with cold water. Add one-half the amount of salt and boil for five minutes. Drain, cover with boiling water and cook until tender. Drain, saving one-fourth cup of liquor. Melt the fat in a saucepan; add the flour, pepper, and the rest of the salt. Cook until bubbling, then add gradually the milk and the vegetable's liquor, stirring constantly. Cook until thickened. Place the diced turnips in a serving dish; make a hollow in the center in which place the onions. Pour the white sauce over all and sprinkle the turnips with minced parsley and the onions with paprika or grated cheese. Green onions may be used in their season. Serves six.

Devil Dogs

4 squares bitter chocolate
1 cup milk
½ cup sugar
Boil the above ingredient for 10 minutes, then add one teaspoon of vanilla.
½ cup butter, creamed thoroughly
1 cup sugar
3 eggs, beaten separately
½ cup milk
1 teaspoon soda, dissolved in ½ in tablespoons boiling water
2 cups flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
Mix above ingredients thoroughly, adding melted chocolate and egg whites last. Place tablespoon of batter on cookie sheet about two inches apart, in oblong shape. Bake in oven at 350 degrees about 20 minutes. After cakes are cooled, place two cakes together with raspberry jam and boiled icing between. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.
