**County Republicans in Banquet Saturday Night of Last Week**

Secretary of State William J. Stratton and three state legislators from this district were honored Saturday night at the first banquet of the Lake County Central Republican committee at the Karcher hotel.

In answer to rumors that the executive committee was not alert in getting appointments for county residents Attorney Max Przyborski, chairman, announced that from all that could be learned no appointments would be made prior to July 1. He assured the 125 at the banquet that the executive committee would do everything within its power to get recognition from the state for the county.

Rep. Lee McDonough, Waukegan, explained his reason for voting against the old age pension bill, that provides \$260 annually for residents more than 70 years of age. Before McDonough was reached on the roll call the house had carried the bill but he voted against it. No reliable surveys have been made, he pointed out, that would serve as a basis for appropriations or give the state an idea of what the expense would be.

Rep. Richard Lyons, Mundelein, State Senator Ray Paddock, Wauconda, States Attorney A. V. Smith, Circuit Judge Claire C. Edwards, Probate Judge Martin C. Decker and Attorney Benj. Miller were among the speakers. All urged the continuation of the banquets and Mr. Przyborski stated that plans would be carried out three or four times a year and be extended to the women members of the organization.

**Scout Leaders Hold Banquet and Meeting**

Nearly 60 scoutmasters and other leaders gathered at the scout headquarters building in Highland Park on Monday evening, March 25 at 6:30 and held a fine dinner meeting.

Before dinner the scout leaders inspected the newly organized council office. After the party dinner in the spacious dining room adjacent to the office, the men joined in singing some peppy songs, led by Mr. Rudolph Weight, scoutmaster of Troop 77, Mundelein, with Mrs. Rybolt at the piano.

Each scoutmaster present then reported to the roll-call of the troops, by giving their name, rank, and length of service in scouting. Most every troop was represented.

Mr. Karl D. King, president of the council welcomed all these leaders and extended appreciation in behalf of the council for the fine attendance.

Dr. Charles A. Steele of Glencoe, chairman of the Council Camping committee presented information about the new camp site in Wisconsin. He stressed particularly the idea of the scoutmaster taking his own troop to camp. He told of the many advantages of the new camp site and how adequately it fits the needs of scouting.

Myron C. Rybolt, scout executive, then discussed and outlined the new council procedure in regard to courts of honor and troop awards.
