F. W. Meierhoff, Old Resident, Dies On Saturday; Funeral

Frederick W. Meierhoff, 29 North Green Bay road, a resident of Highland Park for nearly 30 years and well known in the community, passed away Saturday evening in the Highland Park hospital, where he had been for two weeks following a stroke. He was 76 years of age.

Mr. Meierhoff was born Dec. 4, 1853, near Northbrook and lived in that vicinity until he and his family removed to this city in 1900. His wife, whose maiden name was Mary Gloss, died in 1894, and two of their children died in infancy and an older son, Oscar, 17 years ago. The living members of the family are five sons and a daughter—Miss Agnes Meierhoff and Walter Meierhoff, Highland Park; Henry of Wilmette, Erwin of Glenview, Reuben of Duluth, Minn., and Rev. Arthur Meierhoff of Bridgport, Neb. There are 11 grandchildren.

Other near relatives are two brothers and two sisters, Henry of California; August of Florida; Mrs. Sophie Dehne of Glenview and Mrs. Emma Voltz of Chicago, all of whom attended the funeral except the brother in California.

Mr. Meierhoff was a member of the Evangelical Lutheran church of Deerfield and a man held in high esteem by a wide circle of friends in the community, whose sorrow is profound at the ending of his long and useful life. The family have the sincere sympathy of all at this time.

Following a song and prayer at the home of the daughter, Miss Agnes, South Green Bay road, the funeral service was held Tuesday afternoon at the Deerfield Lutheran church, pastor, the Rev. Mr. Roth officiating, and burial was in the cemetery there. A quartet composed of Dr. and Mrs. Earl Fritsch and Mr. and Mrs. Erickson sang, and attendance at the service was large. The floral tribute was large and very beautiful.

Mr. Hess is not only distinguished as one of our finest violin-cellists but he plays on a cello which is one of the few still in existence made by the master craftsman of Cremona Carlo Bergonzi. The instrument played by Mr. Hess was made in 1741 and is of exceptional beauty possessing a tone of exquisite nobility and power.

School Elections

Held on Saturday

April 13; Details

High school and public school elections to choose members of the boards will be held on Saturday, April 13. The school elections of interest here are:

Deerfield-Shields township high school to choose one member of the board in that district will be held April 13, polls open from noon to 7 p. m. The candidate is George Rogers, at present a member of the board. Voting places will be in the East building at the high school, in the city hall in Lake Forest and in the town hall, West Deerfield.

District 107

The annual school election will take place Saturday, April 13th between the hours of two and five o'clock in the afternoon. The polling place will be at the Elm Place school. A nominating petition has been filed to the school board and in compliance with the law the following names will appear on the official ballot:

For President—Mr. George E. Bliss. Members of the board to serve three years: Mrs. Frances C. Creigh and Mr. R. Arthur Wood.

For member of board to fill an unexpired term of two years—Mr. Howell Murray. Mr. Alfred Meyer is withdrawing from the board and Mr. Murray is a candidate to fill out his unexpired term. The other candidates are presenting their names for re-election.

District 108

School District No. 108, Highland Park, Illinois will hold the annual election at the Lincoln school house on Saturday, April 13, 1929, between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 7 o'clock p. m.

There are to be elected a president and two members of the board.

Petitions have been filed for Carleton M. Vail for president, Delmer M. Blasier and George W. Carr for members of the board, to succeed themselves.

In all school elections blank space is provided on the ballots in which voters may write in the names of candidates other than those appearing on the ballot in case the voters desire to vote for some person or persons whose names do not appear thereon.
