Deerfield-Shields Prom Still Hanging in Balance

If the prom is to be held, it's up to the juniors and seniors to buy tickets enough to finance it, says Mr. Schneider.

Two hundred twenty-five juniors and seniors signed up for the prom, pledging themselves to buy tickets. So far, about thirty-five dollars worth of tickets have been sold, but Mr. Schneider has extended the time limit for the sale of tickets to April 15, which is the Monday after the senior play.

Nothing can be done until it is certain that enough tickets have been sold to pay for the expenses. One hundred tickets must be sold, although the goal set is one hundred fifty. If one hundred tickets have been bought and paid for, or at least partly paid for, by April 15, Mr. Schneider can go ahead and start working on the decorations.

"Some people may not agree with me when I make the limit April 15," said Mr. Schneider, "but I know how essential it is. Nobody wants this prom more than I do, but unless one hundred tickets are sold by that time, there can be no prom."

Meanwhile, the various committees are looking about for ideas, but the program and music committees are helpless until the sale of tickets gives them the assurance that the expenses will be paid.

Assemblies By Students Discussed By Councilors

Whether the students should help let the faculty do it was the subject pick out assemblies or continue to of a discussion during the first councilor meeting.

The opinion seemed to be that a great many students were dissatisfied with the assemblies Deerfield has had. Jack Williams, chief councilor, thought that the students should give an assembly at least once a month.
