New Title for Art Institute Theatre

Announcement is made by the Goodman Memorial theater that its acting organization will hereafter be known as the Art Institute of Chicago Civic Repertory company. The plan has been in contemplation by the Art Institute since the Goodman was first organized in 1925; but it was decided to make no claim to the title until the theater had been in operation a sufficient time to establish it in public appreciation. Director Robert B.

Harshe of the Institute and Thomas Wood Steyens, head of the Goodman theater, believe the time is now ripe for placing the Goodman on a civic basis as one of the group of Chicago artistic enterprises represented in other fields by the Symphony Orchestra and the Civic Opera.

The Goodman theater has been in continuous operation as a repertory theater for the past four years under the direction of Mr. Stevens. With him, the producing staff includes B. Iden Payne, Whitford Kane and Cloyd Head, the latter also business manager. In addition to the professional acting company of 20 players, the Goodman operates a school of the theater which gives its own performances independently, including the popular Saturday matinees for children. With the completion of the new Studio theater, now under construction, the organization will have two finely equipped theaters at its disposal. No direct change of policy is contemplated in the announcement. The present plan is to enlarge the acting organization as rapidly as funds permit, to keep successful plays in repertory, and to maintain its present status as a non-profit making enterprise with prices as low as

may prove to be consistent with a progressive policy.
