

### George F. Goodnow Is Dead; Funeral Today; Lived Here 15 Years

George F. Goodnow, a resident of Highland Park for the last 15 years, passed away at his home, 806 South Green Bay road on Tuesday morning of this week. He had been in ill health for several years, and was quite ill the last two weeks.

Mr. Goodnow was born November 15, 1863, in Rochester, Vt., and was therefore aged 65 years, four months and 25 days, at the time of his death. He is survived by his wife and two sons, Albert C. Goodnow of Glencoe and George N. Goodnow, who is a student at Cornell university, Ithaca, N. Y. Both sons are married.

Mr. Goodnow was by profession a consulting engineer in which profession he had attained marked success. Formerly he was connected with the North Shore Gas Co. He had many warm friends both here and in Chicago whose sorrow at the

close of his long and useful life is sincere, and the family have the profound sympathy of the community in their bereavement.

The funeral service will be held this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the funeral chapel of the H. M. Prior Co., and interment will be in the Elmwood cemetery in Cook county.
