Planting Trees, Shrubs, or Plants

In the planting of any plants, regardless if it be a trees, shrub or perennial, the ground should be cultivated or spaded up as deep as the tree shrub or plant is planted. When the ground has thus been prepared the plant to be planted, should be inserted in the ground as near as possible, the depth that it originally stood in the nursery. It is a very common practice with some people to plant altogether too deep.

Watering. The proper way to water a perennial is to pour about a pint of water in the bottom of the hole and inserting the plant so that the roots are barely covered in the mud and filling up the hole around the crown of the plant with loose mellow dirt.

In the watering of shrubs one should dig out the hole the proper depth of the shrub, throw in a half

bucket or bucketfull of water set the tree or shrub in the mush and fill with loose dirt. Where a person has a large number of shrubs to plant, one can save time by forcing the hose with the water running down beside the shrub or tree and allow to run until the ground seems fairly filled with water.

Cultivation following transplanting. Keeping the ground well stirred about the plants after they have been transplanted, will prevent the moisture from rising to the surface and being dried by the sun and winds. I wish to state that this after cultivation has just as great a part to play with the success of your plant's growth as having the plants properly planted to begin with. It is a common nursery practice to plant any kind of plants including perennials, shrubs or Evergreens without watering at all but where thorough after cultivation is practiced we lose hardly a plant.
