Death of John Ahart, Sr., who passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. E. V. Orvis, 29 North St. James street, Waukegan, last week, closed the career of one of the oldest residents in Lake county. He had resided in this county for all of his 80 years of life.

Arriving in Waukegan last week from Kewanee, G. Robert Galloway, newly-elected secretary and manager of the Waukegan and North Chicago Chamber of Commerce, assumed his desk in the headquarters of the association and immediately plunged into the multifarious duties that go with the position.

Everett Tromblee, a junior at the Libertyville High school and the star dash man of the track team, was painfully injured last week when he was burned about the right hand and rendered unconscious on coming in contact with a live electric wire in the shower room of the school.

Roger Swan, aged 19, son of H. J. Swan, who resides in Mundelein, but who is manager of the Armour & company office and storage house in Waukegan, died at his home last week after a short illness.

Stricken as he was working in the garden of the estate of F. W. Scott, member of the Chicago firm of Carson, Pirie, Scott, in Glencoe last week, Frank Viegels, aged 61 years, of Lake Forest, died of heart disease a few minutes later.

Mrs. Jessie Wallace, aged 82 years, a prominently known resident of Grayslake, died at her home last week after a long illness. She and her husband would have celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary in May.

Mrs. Mary Nolan, a resident of the county the full 72 years of her life, died last week after being in poor health for several months. The family residence was at 510 North Genesee street.
