## COUNCIL DECLARES STORY MISLEADING

### Adopts Resolution Scoring Tale in Another Newspaper About Green Bay Paving

Declaring that "grossly misleading statements" were made in the last issue of the Highland Park news regarding court proceedings in connection with the North Green Bay improvement, the city council at Monday evening's meeting unanimously adopted a resolution to the effect that a statement of the facts as shown in the testimony had not been published, that the court has not finally passed on the improvement nor has the case been finally settled and that therefore the city attorney and Windes & Marsh, engineers, be instructed to prepare a statement of the facts in the case to be given to the press.

A communication from R. E. Clark recommending the correction of the amounts assessed against certain lots under Highland Park special assessment No. 333 was approved and referred to the attorney to make the necessary corrections.

A communication from Mrs. Mary Flinn was ordered placed on file and the city clerk instructed to check up the title to the property on which the sidewalk is to be laid.

Commissioner Reay moved that the bill of Walter A. Shaw in the amount of \$508.86 be approved and voucher issued in payment of same. The motion prevailed.

#### Grant Permit

Commissioner Brown moved that the North Shore Gas company be granted a permit to relay their gas main on Roger Williams avenue from Green Bay road to Sheridan road and on Sheridan road from Roger Williams avenue to the County Line road in accordance with the plans submitted therefor. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Reay moved that Pearce, Greeley & Hansen be allowed a payment of \$750.00 for engineering services in connection with the improvements and betterments to the Highland Park Water Works. The motion prevailed.

The report of A. E. Smith, justice of the peace, showing fines collected in the amount of \$30.00 was ordered placed on file.

Commissioner Brown moved that Windes & Marsh be instructed to prepare grades for the construction of a sidewalk on the easterly side of Sheridan road from Deere Park to the Sheridan road bridge and on the westerly side of Sheridan road from the Sheridan road bridge to the County Line. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Zimmer moved that the city collector be instructed to make the corrections under Highland Park special assessment No. 298 against the property of Walter B. Metcalf, in accordance with the corporation counsel's recommendation. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Reay moved the passage of an ordinance providing for the construction of a concrete cement sidewalk on the west side of Laurreta place from Walker avenue to North avenue, said ordinance having remained on file for public inspection

as required by law. The motion prevailed.

#### To Bond Taxicab Operators

Commissioner Brown moved that an ordinance requiring bonds from the operators of taxicabs in the city of Highland Park, be placed on file for one week before its final passage. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Gourley moved that the property owners' petition for the division of special assessment levied against the E I A, S 1/2, S 1/2, SW 1/4, sec. 36, 43, 12 for the construction of the west feeder system of water mains under warrant No. 298, be accepted and that the corporation counsel be instructed to present said petition to the county court for approval. The motion prevailed.

#### Approve Police Bond

Commissioner Gourley moved that the bond of Clarence Pfister, special police officer, in the amount of \$5,000.00 with Thomas Duffy and Eugene Pfister as sureties, be approved. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Zimmer moved that the bid of P. Ugolini for the construction of a sidewalk on the south side of Taylor avenue be rejected and the city clerk instructed to readvertise for bids for the construction of said walk. The motion prevailed.

#### Resolution Adopted

Commissioner Reay moved the adoption of the following resolution: Whereas, there has been grossly misleading statements made in the last week's issue of the Highland Park News with reference to the court proceedings in connection with the North Green Bay road paving improvement, warrant No. 326, and, whereas, the court has not finally passed upon the improvement or the case finally settled, therefore, be it resolved that the attorney and Windes & Marsh, be instructed to prepare an article stating the facts in the case and give the correct information to the press for publication. The motion prevailed.

#### Permit for Footbridge

Commissioner Gourley moved that Mr. George McBride be granted a permit to construct a footbridge from his property to and connecting with the North Linden avenue highway bridge, subject to the approval of Windes & Marsh, engineers. The motion prevailed.

A petition from property owners and residents living in the vicinity of St. Johns avenue and Sheridan road was presented objecting to the city of Highland Park granting any permit to E. O. Ek, for the construction of any building as long as said E. O. Ek continues to operate his present premises in violation of the zoning ordinance.

Commissioner Reay moved that said petition be presented to the Highland Park zoning board of appeals with the request that the petition be returned to the city for their files. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Brown moved that the specifications for a street sweeper be approved and the city clerk instructed to advertise for bids for the furnishing of a street sweeper in accordance with said specifications, said bids to be received by the council in open session on Monday, April 29, 1929 at 7:30 o'clock, p. m. The motion prevailed.
