City to Remove Shrubs at Dangerous Corners

The city administration is continuing its policy, started last fall, of removing shrubs etc., from parkways at street intersections where they obstruct the view of motorists on the streets and are deemed a menace to safety, it was announced this week at the city hall.

It was also pointed out that last fall some property owners, who were notified to remove shrubs from parkways asked for time until spring, when transplanting could be done to better advantage, have so far failed to move the shrubs, and notice is being issued by the city that unless this is done forthwith, the city will proceed to cut down the obstructing shrubs at dangerous corners.
