29th, 1929, for the furnishing of one motor
driven pick up sweeper in accordance with
the following specifications:

The whole vehicle shall be delivered com-
plete and in perfect working condition. No
bid will be considered from any bidder who
cannot show that he has been engaged in
the construction and successful operation of
the type of machine described for a period
of approximately five (5) years.

Inspectors shall have full access to all parts
of the plant where these machines are man-
ufactured. They shall be notified and given
an opportunity to be present at tests of the
machine and shall have all necessary facili-
ties and aid in examining and measuring all
parts.

Machine shall develop not less than 35
Horse Power and have a sweeping speed of
from four to six miles per hour. Must be
equipped with gutter broom, spraying sys-
tem, two adjustable lamps in front and one
on rear, electric or other satisfactory horn
or signal, and two sets of brakes either set
being capable of holding the vehicle fully
on a 15% grade.

Must be supplied with complete set of
tools, 3 ton jack, broom rack and necessary
equipment for refilling brooms.

Manufacturer must also furnish necessary
instructions for operation of machine and
refilling of brooms.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certi-
fied check made payable to the Mayor of
the City of Highland Park for the sum of
not less than ten (10) per cent of the aggre-
gate of the proposal.
