
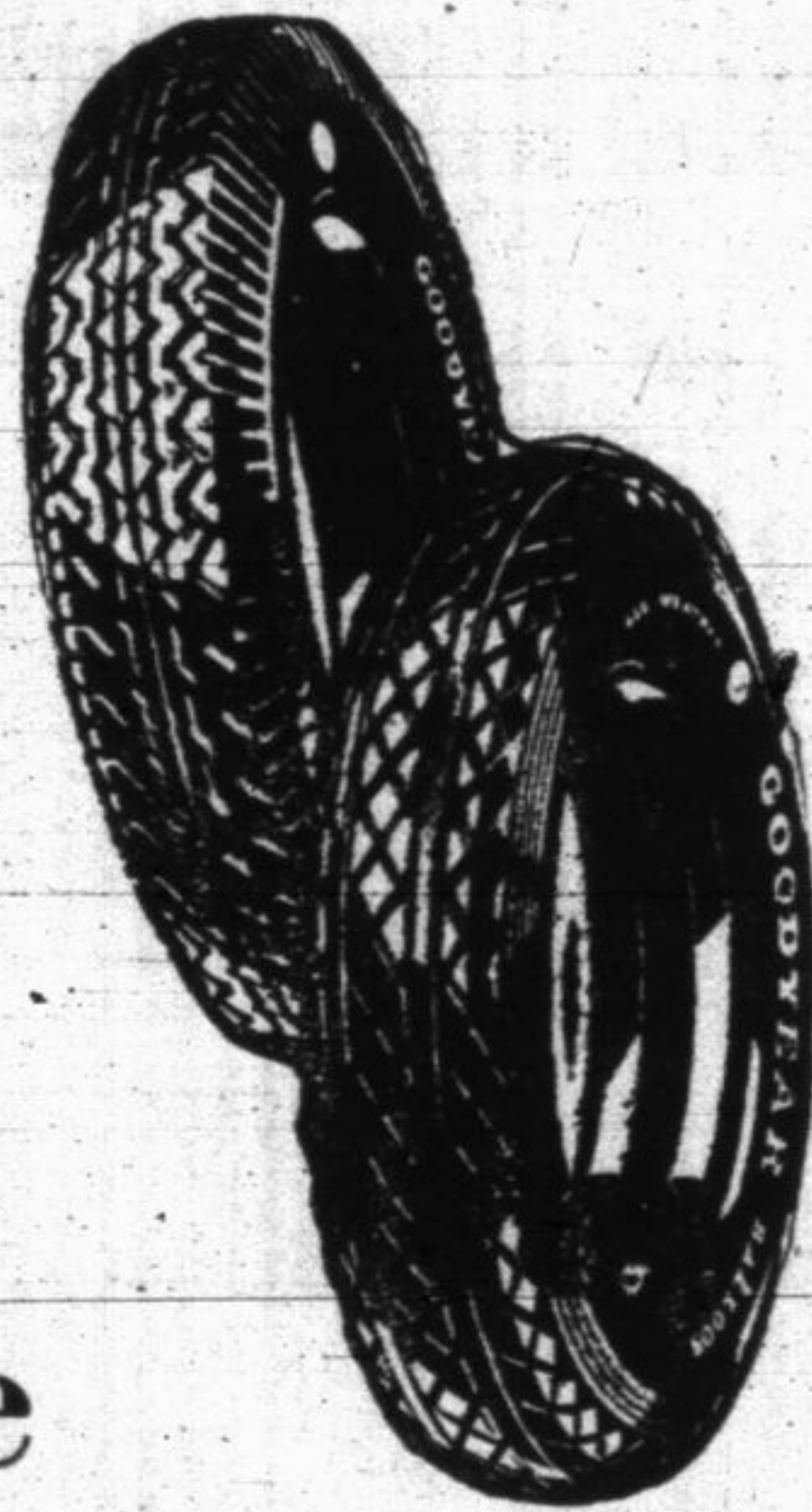

Supervisors Meet Soon to Reorganize

Call for a meeting of the board of supervisors, for the purpose of reorganization, was issued last week in the county clerk's office where several members of the board signed a petition for a meeting.

No date was set on the call by Supervisor Thomas V. Murphy of North Chicago, stated that he understood that the plans were to hold it April 18.

The most important business for this session will be the election of a chairman. Supervisors James O'Connor, Deerfield, William Obee of Highland Park, Harry Stratton of Lake Villa, and Frank Stanton of Ingleside, have all been mentioned as possibilities.

Seven new members, four from Waukegan, will be introduced to the board at that time: William Rosing will come from Antioch; E. Miller from Libertyville; Emil Bollinger from Lake Forest, and John McCann, D. A. Hutton, W. C. Berry and Fred Decker from Waukegan. The membership, by virtue of the population, has been increased from 34 to 37 members.

Northbrook Winner of League Contest

Northbrook defeated Lake Zurich in the finals of the Northwest Suburban Basketball league recently at Lake Zurich by a score of 33 to 25. Hohlfelder and Capt. Richards starred for the winning team, scoring a majority of the points. The other members of the Northbrook quintet were William Lutz, William Clore and V. Landwehr. The winners will be awarded a silver trophy emblematic of the league championship.

Northbrook went through the season with 17 victories and three defeats. Lake Zurich finished in second and third place honors went to Deerfield.

Bill in House Would Re-apportion Districts

The Heusch congressional apportionment bill now before the Illinois state legislature, does away with the two congressmen at large, giving Cook county two additional districts. A district is left for every downstate, state congressman.

The downstate apportionment as provided in the Heusch bill includes the following proposed changes in this section of the state.

Thirteenth — Will, DuPage, Kane and Kendall.

Fourteenth—Lake, McHenry, Boone and Winnebago.
