

Lumber Concerns to Grade Label Product

In order that the public may get full advantage of American Lumber Standards, and avoid mistakes in house construction, leading lumber manufacturers of this country are going to trade and grade mark all lumber made in accordance with them. Those marks will clearly indicate the grade of each piece of lumber upon

which a manufacturer's mark appears and signify the specific purpose for which it is best adapted. With such marks as guidance the average citizen can buy lumber with the same degree of confidence with which he buys any trade marked commodity of recognized quality. And a house built of such lumber will be a trade and grade marked house, a house of quality; in effect, a "pedigreed" or certified house.

Such lumber will be even more satisfactorily distinguishable to the average citizen who knows little or nothing about lumber qualities when there appears alongside the trade and grade mark, applied by an expert grader under the supervision of a regional manufacturers association, what is known as the "National Tree Symbol." This symbol is in the form of a little tree the top of which surrounds the letter "N". The National Tree symbol financially guarantees to the dealer that each piece of lumber upon which it appears is of the grade and size indicated by the regional association's trade and grade mark alongside of it. If the dealer extends this guarantee to the lumber buyer, as he is expected to do, then the owner of the house in which it is used has a financial guaranty that it is a trade and grade marked house of quality and durability.

Both Dr. Woodward and Dr. Eiselen were formerly professors at Northwestern. Dr. Woodward was professor of law for five years, from 1902 to 1907, when he resigned to accept a professorship of law at Leland Stanford university. He was made dean of the law school there in 1910. In 1916 he went to the University of Chicago as professor of law, and in 1926 was made vice-president of the university and dean of the faculties. Since the resignation of Dr. Max Mason as president of the University of Chicago, Dr. Woodward has been acting president.

Dr. Eiselen was professor of Biblical literature at Northwestern from 1918 to 1924. He went to Garrett Biblical Institute as professor of Semitic languages in 1902, and in 1924 was made president.

Rising Lake Level Is Causing Much Trouble

Lake Michigan, in the third year of an upward swell, has lifted the Chicago river to a level interfering with navigation of harbor tugs under the city bridges and backing up sewage flow in the industrial districts. Midway of a predicted nine year upward cycle, the lake climbed three and one-half feet since 1926 and in some places has obliterated beaches along the Chicago shore.

The Calendar of Plant Feeding THIS MONTH

1. LAWNS: As soon as grass shows green, or any time thereafter, apply plant food.
2. FLOWERS: Work plant food into soil before seeding; or for perennials, as soon as plants appear. For early large and richly colored blooms make later feedings.
3. VEGETABLES: Work plant food into the soil before seeding. Later feedings will hasten maturity, increase yields.
4. SHRUBS, TREES: Apply plant food any time after leaves appear.
