

Asst. Supt. Watson of Glencoe Schools Quits

The resignation of Norman E. Watson, assistant superintendent of the Glencoe Public schools since 1925, and secretary of the Glencoe Board of Education since 1926, was accepted at a special meeting of the board last week. Mr. Watson presented his resignation at the regular meeting of the board Tuesday of the previous week. It was not accepted at that time and the board delayed action to see if Mr. Watson would reconsider the matter. This he has declined to do. Mr. Watson has not announced his future plans.

Mr. Watson came to Glencoe in March, 1925, after completing a post graduate course in education at the University of Chicago. Since then he has taken a prominent part in Glencoe community activities, as well as in the affairs of the schools.

New Trier Supt. Back from European Trip

Supt. Frederick E. Clerk of New Trier high school stated in a telegram received at the school last week that he arrived in New York from Europe Monday, April 8, and expected to be back at his desk this week. The telegram also mentioned that the boat on which the Clerk family made the return journey to America had been delayed by storms on the Atlantic ocean. Superintendent Clerk has been in Europe for six months making a study of secondary education methods.

Doepel Elected Head of Winnetka Chamber

Robert F. Doepel was elected to the presidency of the Winnetka Chamber of Commerce at the meeting of that body last week.

The installation of officers will be held at the time of the annual dinner, May 13, for which an extensive program is being arranged.

The staff of newly elected officers for this year includes, in addition to President Doepel, Vic J. Killian, first vice-president; William T. Wersted, third vice-president; Abe Fell, fourth vice-president; Francis Phelan, fifth vice-president; O. L. Porter, treasurer; B. G. Eberle, secretary.

The foregoing officers, together with H. W. Paulson and W. E. Zick, constitute the board of directors.

New Trier High School Given Fine Painting

In recognition of the presentation of the cabinet scene from John Drinkwater's "Abraham Lincoln" at the 1929 Lincoln's birthday exercises for high schools of Chicago and suburbs, the Union League club, which sponsors the exercises each year, has presented to New Trier high school a sand dune painting by F. Darge. The painting has been hung in the main floor corridor opposite the school offices. M. E. Duckles, New Trier faculty member, played the part of Lincoln when the cabinet scene was presented, and members of Lincoln's cabinet were portrayed by seven New Trier boys—Kingsley Karnopp, Dorrance Nygaard, Carl Hall, Martin Cassell, William Gibson, John Betak, and John Atwood.

Plumbing Small Part of Cost of Building

Builders have found that the cost of plumbing fixtures and installation is 9.9 per cent of the total cost of a home.

The cost of the heating plant and its installation in the average home is 8.3 per cent.

Thus the total cost of these two items is less than 20 per cent of the price the owner pays for his home. In view of this comparatively low cost and the importance of plumbing and heating, the home builder should not try to cut down on these items, it is pointed out by builders. If he does try to cut down, it is likely that he will have to spend money on repairs in a few years.

Considering that such important basic features of the home may be had for such a small part of the total cost, the 18.2 cents should not be cut down and should be made to buy the best quality available.

The Hubbard Woods Improvement association has just uncovered some interesting figures on the population of that district.

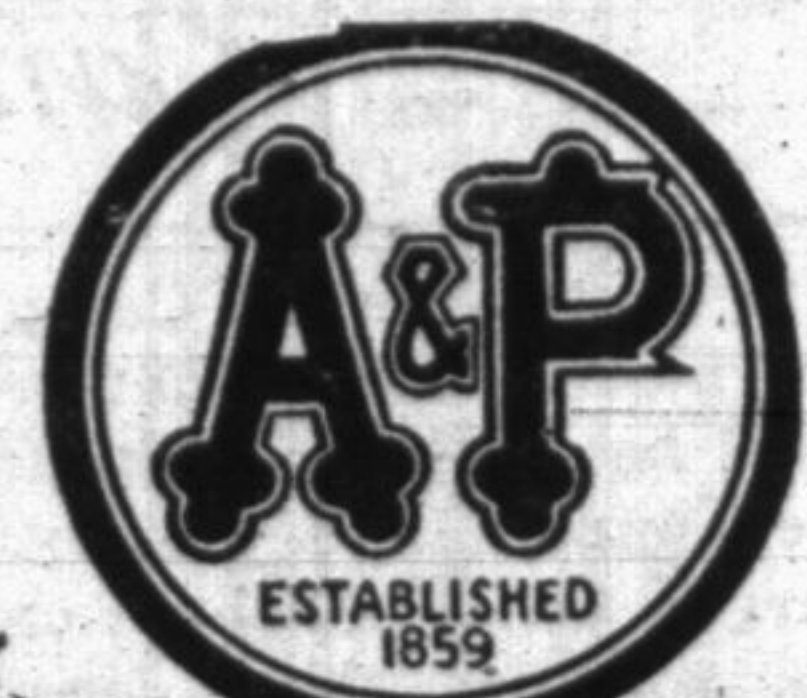
The community known as Hubbard Woods is taken to include the area bounded by the lake, the Skokie, Westmoor road, El Dorado street and Jackson avenue, Glencoe. The astonishing growth of the district is indicated by the fact that last year's mailing list of the association a reasonably complete one, contained the names of 740 families. This year's list, compiled through the courtesy of Winnetka and Glencoe officials, from the respective village water meter lists, contains 1,219 families (with a few business houses included). Of these 887 families live on the Winnetka side and 332 on the Glencoe side of the boundary line.
